NEW! DNA ANALYSIS: Ever wonder what genes you carry? Our Biotech classes have been studying the gene that allows one to taste a bitter molecule, PTC. This gene is also implicated in the adversity to eating broccoli. From an evolution standpoint, the ability to taste the bitter PTC molecule allowed our ancestors to avoid eating toxic plants, thus giving them a survival advantage. If you want more info or reading material, we can supply it or have a student come explain it to you. Our students have genotyped themselves to determine if they have the gene to taste PTC and have conducted a taste test as well. Now for your help...

Jeannie's and my students need an opportunity to extract, isolate, cut, and analyze DNA to improve their laboratory skills. If you would like to find out if you can taste PTC and your genotype, please contact one of us. Below is the process we will use next week (the week of April 20).

- 1. <u>Tuesday, April 21:</u> Students will bring you a saltwater solution to swish in your mouth and a tube to put the swished solution into. They will also give you a PTC strip to taste and will record your tasting ability.
- 2. <u>Wednesday, April 22:</u> Students will extract the DNA from your sample and run a Polymerase Chain Reaction to amplify the PTC gene. This takes about 3 hours.
- 3. <u>Thursday, April 23:</u> Students will cut the gene that was amplified into segments and run them on an agarose gel. From the gel, we will take UV pictures and determine if you have the gene (or not).
- 4. Monday, April 27: We will report out to teachers the results.
