NEW! STUDENTS IN NEED: Just a reminder that if you notice a student is in need of school supplies, new shoes, clothing, glasses, etc., we have access to resources that can assist. We've already been able to give out over 30 backpacks (filled with school supplies) and are hoping to receive more to give out as the year progresses. Some stats to consider: Currently we have 20 students who qualify for KIT (a program that supports students who qualify as homeless under federal McKinney-Vento legislation; students who lack a fixed, regular, or adequate nighttime residence may qualify), and 445 students (21% of our student population) who qualify for Free/Reduced lunch. As always, thanks for letting the counseling office know if you feel a student may be in need of additional support. NEW! FAMILY ADVOCATE: I want to reintroduce myself to you all, especially as there are SO many new faces among the Wolf Pack! (yay!!) In April, the school district implemented a new community liaison/advocacy position (originally titled "Student Support Advocate" but aptly renamed "Family Advocate") through a grant from Snohomish County. I spent a couple of months getting my feet wet, meeting many students, families and incredible teachers/staff among the Jackson family. There are advocates at Cascade (Leslie Brent) and Everett (Belinda Zintzun) as well, and we all three come from social services prior to this position! The gist of the job is to be a connector; I can help families/students/staff access local resources, generally within Snohomish County but beyond if necessary. There may be folks who are struggling navigating the insurance system, need help finding clothing or personal care items, don't have access to housing (may or may not be a K.I.T. student/family), need court support, emergency shelter, access to various legal services, etc. The possibilities are endless, really! Many of you may have already learned how to access the awesome social services within our area, and I'd love your insight. As well, I'd appreciate any referrals of students and/or families who may be struggling in an area you are unsure of how to help with. As a team (it takes a village—or a PACK, right?), we can advocate for our JHS families in the most productive ways possible. My office is C202 and I encourage visitors, phone calls, emails—plus any questions you may have. As the weeks progress, I'll reach out to you all again to let you know some of the projects I'm continuing to work on: food and clothing closet, hygiene kits, and more! Make it a great year, folks!
