We have met with members of our school's administration and key district staff to get approval for a rain garden that will be located in the grass area outside of the staff lounge. As we are very close to contracts being signed, we have just a couple things to address. With one, we would like to ask for **your help**.

<u>Background</u>: We have put together a very clear and thorough maintenance schedule and checklist that Project Green and future Environmental Systems Design classes will be using, but half the support isn't assigned until kids get their class schedules in September.
