As a result of the one-day walkout, Everett Public Schools is canceling school on **Friday**, **May 22**, **2015**. The following activities will proceed as scheduled on May 22:

CORRECTION: NEW GRAD REQUIREMENTS: As a reminder to ALL STAFF, these are the changes starting with the class of 2016:

- English increased from 3.5 to 4.0 credits (Eng 1, Eng 2, Eng 3, 1.0 of senior English)
- Social Studies increased from 2.5 to 3.0 (to meet grad requirements, students will need an additional .5 social studies elective beyond 1.0 WH, 1.0 U.S., and .5 Gov't—such as I-Geography, Global Issues, Psychology, Philosophy)
- Other requirements remain the same until the class of 2019, when the total credits needed for graduation increases to 24, World Language is required or a Personalized Pathway Requirement, and students will need 2.0 credits of Art or 1.0 Art and 1.0 of a Personalized Pathway Requirement.
