

SMARTER BALANCED ASSESSMENTS: Following are three things you can do with your students to help them prepare for the Smarter Balanced Assessments (SBA) in ELA and Math later this spring.

- 1. **Chromebook Training.** The SBA will be taken on Chromebooks. Please plan on giving your students some time on the Chromebooks. The more time they spend with the Chromebooks, the more comfortable they will feel when they take the SBA. You can become more comfortable with Chromebooks and the SBA environment by taking the Chromebook training. You can sign up for the training through the "Chromebook" link under the "Our Staff" tab when you sign in to the Henry M. Jackson website. Our in-house trainers will help you with the training during LIF on January 9 and/or February 6 in the library.
- 2. Smarter Balanced Practice and Training Tests. Practice and training tests are now available for the SBA ELA and Math tests. The practice tests mirror the actual SBA. Students and teachers can take the ELA and Math practice tests as guests. The tests use the same online tools as the actual tests. Each assessment has 30 items similar to the Computer Adaptive Test (CAT) of the actual assessment and a performance task (PT). This is a great way to get your students some familiarity with the SBA. - 3. **Smarter Balanced Digital Library.** Teachers can sign up for the Digital Library. The Digital Library provides a wealth of resources for teachers. You will need an account to access these resources. Your initial account will be your Everett email address as your user ID, and your password will be EPS followed by your employee ID number. THE AUSSIES ARRIVE! Friday, Jan. 9, 35 Australian students and chaperones will be arriving in Mill Creek and the home of the Timberwolves. This is our 20th year hosting Australian students and their chaperones. As you may know, they spend most of their visit touring local sights but will also spend one day with their hosts attending classes at Jackson. They will be at JHS next **Friday, Jan. 16**.

You may have a guest in your classes (with one of your students) on that day. Our guests will arrive daily with their student hosts and are dropped off in the Annex to wait for their excursion bus. Jackson students are to be in class as usual and on time. I always get asked if our Jackson host students can join the Australians on their daily excursions around Seattle and the areas, but that is <u>not</u> an option. The Australians will leave Jackson around 7:45 a.m. daily for their excursion and will return at 3:30 p.m. to be picked up by their Jackson hosts.

This should not interfere with any JHS student being in your class daily. Our guests are merely observing if they are in your class, and it is up to you whether or not you want to introduce them and/or have any dialogue as a class with them. Please do not alter your curriculum as I am well aware that finals are coming up. The Aussies are expected to be accompanied by a Jackson student at all times while at school. If you have any concerns about having an extra student in your class for one period, please let me know and I will gladly arrange for our guest to visit another class.
