

The Food Allergy & Anaphylaxis Network

In 1998, the Food Allergy & Anaphylaxis Network, now FARE, created Food Allergy Awareness Week to educate the public about food allergies, a potentially life-threatening medical condition. This is a special opportunity to shine a spotlight on food allergies, raise awareness, educate others and inspire action. Here are some facts you may not know about food allergies:

- Food allergies can be life-threatening and are a serious and growing public health problem – one for which there currently is no cure.
- They affect up to 15 million Americans, including nearly 6 million children roughly two in every classroom. If all of the kids with a food allergy lived in one state, it would be the 19th largest state (by population) in the U.S.
- Nearly 40 percent of these children have already experienced a severe or lifethreatening reaction. In addition, more than 30 percent of these children have multiple food allergies.
- According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, the number of
- children with food allergies in the U.S. increased 50 percent between 1997 and 2011 but there is no clear answer as to why
- A reaction to food can range from a mild response (such as an itchy mouth) to anaphylaxis, a severe and potentially deadly reaction. Every three minutes, a food allergy reaction sends someone to the emergency room in the U.S.
- Having a child with food allergy increases the yearly cost of raising a child by about 30 percent, which costs American families a total of nearly \$25 billion per year.

Kids in Transition program in Everett Public Schools

The Kids in Transition (KIT) program supports students who qualify as homeless under federal McKinney-Vento legislation. Students who lack a fixed, regular, or adequate nighttime residence may qualify. The KIT program works to eliminate barriers to students' academic success and extra-curricular participation. We ensure homeless students have school supplies and provide tutoring or facilitate student participation in extended day or summer school classes. We help students participate in activities such as sports or clubs by paying required fees. KIT provides transportation for eligible students to maintain school stability, as long as the commute is feasible. Last year, Everett Public Schools served over 900 homeless students at some time during the school year.
