### Principal's Corner:

#### Madison Parent-Teacher Conference Follow Up

I want to thank all the parents that attended our conferencing week from October 27th-31<sup>st</sup>. We had a wonderful participation rate with our parents. The strong partnership between the parents and teachers is an essential function of a high performing school. Now the question is where do we go from here?

Research has shown that parental involvement is the most important factor in a student's success in school. Involvement needs to extend beyond the initial attendance of a parentteacher conference.

#### **STEPS TO FOLLOW UP**

Reflect on the conference as soon as possible, ideally immediately following. Make notes regarding follow-up responsibilities. Write down any recommendations and set goals with specific dates, such as memorizing multiplication tables through 5's by the end of the second quarter.

Make sure you keep checking in with your child's educator throughout the school year, not just at the parent teacher conference. And make sure your child is involved with the conversation. Fill them in on the goals from the parent teacher conference, and hold them accountable accordingly. Review teacher suggestions for activities and strategies families can use at home to help their child learn and grow. Emphasize lines of communication between home and school. Describe how communication will take place (notes home, phone calls, email, etc). If necessary, schedule a follow up on the conference.

As highlighted consistently in research, when parents are involved with their child's education throughout the school year, students have:

- •Higher grades, test scores, and graduation rates.
- •Better school attendance.
- •Increased motivation.
- •Lower rates of suspension.
- •Decreased use of drugs and alcohol.
- •Fewer instances of violent behavior

Please don't hesitate to call if you have any questions about your student's performance at Madison or suggestions for making the schooling process even more successful. Your involvement is very much appreciated and as mentioned throughout educational research-<u>THE MOST IMPORTANT</u> <u>FACTOR!</u>
