Principal's Corner:

The month of October is shaping up as another busy month. Our MLT (Madison Leadership Team) will be working on modifying our 2013-14 SIP (School Improvement Plan) to reflect the areas of focus as indicated by Madison's test results. The goal is to have a working draft by October 15th. Parents will be able to view this document on our campus website or request a copy from the office.

On Wednesday, October 8th, Officer Tim Reeves will discuss campus safety from 3-3:30 in the library. The details of the presentation were already outlined in a previous *Husky Highlights*. Additionally, we will have our crossing guards back in place this week. Again, we are trying to be proactive in addressing student safety concerns.

(For Kindergarten only)

For parents that walk to pick up their students, this will take place outside the kindergarten exit doors. An adult inside will notify students as parents come by. These students will no longer be part of the car pick-up that takes place from the cafeteria. The effective date for this is Wednesday, October $8^{\rm th}$.

As you know, <u>October 10th is a student holiday</u> and Learning Improvement Day (LID). Christy Clausen (Lit. Curr. Specialist) will be on campus (1:00-2:00) to highlight district resources available to teachers. This will be a workshop setting with time for teacher interaction addressing designing lessons for furthering writing skills.

Extended Day-

Extended Day for both reading and math began this week for third through fifth grade. It is provided so that students who need extra support in reading and math can get that support before school, rather than being pulled out from class during the day. Reading students will be working in Leveled Literacy Intervention to help them to reach grade level in reading. They will also work on building reading fluency through our Read Naturally program. Our ELL students who come to Extended Day will be working in our Imagine Learning English computer program. This program teaches children English and develops their literacy skills faster and better than any other method. Math support will be working with the classroom teachers to help students with the Envision curriculum that is used in the classroom. A variety of math materials will be used to engage students in math practice. Extended Day is Monday through Thursday, from 7:30 to 8:10. There is no extended day on Fridays.

Success Time-

Our Success Time will begin on October 13th. We began this program last school year, to provide extra support for all students, whether for enrichment, maintenance, or remediation. Our focus this year will be in writing, and will provide school wide support, as we work together to build student skills in writing. Student data will be used to form groups depending on their needs in writing, and all staff will work with a group for a half-hour each day in the students area of need.

ELL.

Madison's English Language Learner program has a total of 154 English Language Learners this year. Students in this program receive daily language support though meeting daily with our ELL support teachers, and using our Imagine Learning English computer program.

Looking ahead, the week of October 27th-31st is Parent-Teacher Conferences. Specifics/logistics of these conferences will be available shortly. A parent letter outlining the process for signing up to meet with your child's teacher will be sent.
