# Safety: Our No. | Priority

Student safety is always our No. I priority. The beginning of the school year is a good time to review our safety policies, so please take the time to read this section and discuss the key points with your child.

# Student Supervision Times / Daily Schedule

For safety reasons, it is essential that students not be on campus unless there is adult supervision provided. Here are the times before and after school that staff supervise students, as well as our starting and ending times:

- 8:45: Breakfast begins in the cafeteria. Only students having breakfast at school should be on campus at this time.
- 8:55: Supervision begins in the covered play area. Students not eating breakfast should not arrive before this time.

- 9:10: First bell rings. Teachers generally begin walking students to class a few minutes before this, and continue for a few minutes after.
- 9:15: Tardy bell rings. At this point, students arriving on campus need to get a tardy slip from the office. Tardy students are to walk to class by themselves rather than being escorted by a parent, with the exception of kindergarten students early in the school year.
- 3:30: Dismissal bell rings.
- 3:50: Adult supervision ends, and students still waiting to be picked up are taken into the office to contact parents.

## **Parking Lot Reminders**

The Jefferson parking lot is a very busy place! Please consider parking at Eastmont Park & Ride (0.2 of a mile away) and walking to school. Whenever you are in the parking lot, please follow these guidelines in order to keep everyone safe:

- The speed limit in the parking lot is 5 MPH.
- Be attentive to what is happening around you, and minimize distractions such as cell phones.
- Park only in marked spaces. Do not park in a handicapped space unless you have a placard.
- If dropping off a student in the "kiss and go" lane, the child must exit on the sidewalk side of the vehicle and the driver must remain in the vehicle at all times.
- If picking up a student, stay in your vehicle in the "kiss and go" lane, which begins near the main entrance, and continue to pull forward as the line moves. Your child needs to enter the vehicle from the sidewalk side. We will have visor nametags and directions for use printed and distributed as soon as possible to speed the afternoon pick-up process as much as we can.
- If you are walking, always use a crosswalk and follow Safety Patrol students' directions. If you are driving, never block a crosswalk.
- Never pick up, drop off, wait, or park in the back parking lot, or anywhere along the bus driveway. It is for staff, deliveries, and buses only.


## Walking/Biking Reminders

- Stay on designated paths and sidewalks. Do not ride or walk on the grass.
- Always use crosswalks and follow Safety Patrol students' directions.
- If biking:
  - ♦ Wear a helmet.
  - ♦ Lock your bike each day.
  - Walk your bike on all school sidewalks and the blacktop area.
  - Only students in grades three, four, and five are allowed to bike to school.

## **School Visitor/Volunteer Reminders**

We welcome visitors and volunteers at Jefferson, but ask that you follow these guidelines:

- To volunteer in a classroom, chaperone a field trip, etc., you must have district volunteer clearance. To apply, visit <a href="http://www.everettsd.org/domain/1452">http://www.everettsd.org/domain/1452</a>.
- Please arrange classroom volunteering and visits with the teacher in advance so that he or she is ready for your arrival.
- If visiting campus for any reason, sign in at the office and wear a visitor sticker at all times.
- If dropping off an item such as a lunch or homework, you will need to leave it at the front desk for your child to pick up later so that classroom instruction is not interrupted.

#### **Register to vote!**

#### Access to public records

Many records and documents in Everett Public Schools are available to the public. Parents and other citizens have the right to ask the school district to view or have copies made of records defined as "public" under state and federal laws including their own student's records and public records about discipline of school employees.

Everett Public Schools public records requests are handled by the district's finance and business services office. Records can be requested by writing that office at PO Box 2098, Everett, WA 98213, sending an email to <u>publicrecords@everettsd.org</u> or calling 425-385-4150.

#### Your student's records are confidential

Everett Public Schools takes very seriously its duty to protect student records and privacy. Student transcripts and other educationrelated records are protected by multiple security measures. Only those teachers, administrators and other staff members who work directly with the student and have an educational need to know about the student have access to individual student records. Staff members are expected to maintain confidentiality about information contained in a student's records.

#### Change to vaccination requirements

Students in kindergarten through 12th-grade now need 2 doses of Varicella (chickenpox) vaccine or have a health care provider document that they have already had chickenpox. Review vaccination requirements for your child on this <u>one-page guide</u> from Washington State Department of Health.

#### Safety tip line

Do you or your student have a concern about someone who may be experiencing bullying or harassment? Or perhaps heard a rumor about someone bringing a weapon or drugs to school? **Report it!** You can talk directly with your school's office or you can call, text or email your concern.



If there is reason for concern about safety on a designated walkway to school, calling **9-1-1** immediately will get authorized, quick help. We have strong partnerships with local law enforcement who share our interest in safe schools and neighborhoods.

Student safety is a priority for all of us. Working together, we can help make our neighborhoods and schools nurturing places for students to safely learn and grow.

#### Kids in Transition program in Everett Public Schools

The Kids in Transition (KIT) program supports students who qualify as homeless under federal McKinney-Vento legislation. Students who lack a fixed, regular, or adequate nighttime residence may qualify. The KIT program works to eliminate barriers to students' academic success and extra-curricular participation. We ensure homeless students have school supplies and provide tutoring or facilitate student participation in extended day or summer school classes. We help students participate in activities such as sports or clubs by paying required fees. KIT provides transportation for eligible students to maintain school stability, as long as the commute is feasible.
