From the Principal

March: A Month for Family Involvement!

There are all sorts of ways you can be involved at Jefferson this month:

- Come to fun family events: Bingo Night is at 6:30 p.m. March 10, and Culture Night is at 6:30 p.m. March 20!
- Attend conferences: Be sure to set aside time the last week of the month to attend a conference with your child's teacher. You can provide scheduling input via a form sent home March 3, which is due back March 10. These conferences provide an important opportunity to discuss your child's progress, and to learn about how you can support your child at home.
- Take our survey: Educators are constantly asking ourselves how we are doing in our quest to help students become their very best selves. Now, we want to know how you our community of families think we are doing. Jefferson, like all Everett Public Schools, is committed to continuous improvement. Each year, we seek your insights to help us create our School Improvement Plan. You are invited to take part in this year's anonymous survey developed by the Center for Educational Effectiveness, a Bellevue-based research firm, for Everett Public Schools. You may choose either method to respond to the survey by March 28. Your opinions are very valuable to us, since you are partners in the education of Jefferson students!

Around the Corner: SBA/MSP Testing

Jefferson students in third, fourth, and fifth grades will begin this year's state-mandated Smarter Balanced Assessment testing the second week after spring break. Each grade level will have two days of testing in English language arts (ELA) and two days of testing in math. Fifth-graders will also take the one-day Measurement of Student Progress in science.

It's important to keep these tests in perspective. They are an important snapshot of how students are doing in relation to the Common Core State Standards (ELA/math) and the Washington State Science Learning Standards, but they are just one of many measures we use to understand how students are doing so that we can plan how to help those who are struggling, and challenge those who are ready. We assess students all the time – whether informally, though observations and day-to-day student work, or formally, such as on unit tests. Although these tests are important, they should not be a source of anxiety for students. By teaching our district-adopted curriculum, which is aligned to the standards, and by helping students learn the format of the tests and how to use Chromebooks, our teachers ensure that students will feel ready!

The testing schedule is below; please mark your family calendars accordingly. Although we can provide make-up testing due to illness or emergency, we ask that students be here on time each day, and that you avoid scheduling medical appointments or other absences on testing days.

Families play an important role in helping students be successful each day. Here are some tips:

- Ensure that your child gets a good night's sleep, and has a healthy breakfast that will keep them going all morning.
- Make sure your child gets to school on time. Walking in late can leave students feeling unsettled.
- Encourage your child to do their best, and validate that they are capable. After the test, praise them for their hard work.
- If your child is anxious, talk about self-calming strategies such as positive self-talk or taking deep breaths. If the child's anxiety is especially high, please let the classroom teacher know so that we can provide additional support at school.

Absence reporting

Each time your child is absent, please call the school attendance line, 425-385-7405, to indicate the reason. Per district policy, there are the eight valid excuses for absences and tardies:

- A-District or school-approved activity
- B-Illness, health condition, or medical appointment
- C-Family emergency
- D-Religious purposes (holiday/religious instruction)
- E-Judicial proceeding or jury duty
- F-Post-secondary, technical school or apprenticeship program visit or interview
- G-State-recognized search and rescue activities
- H-Absence directly related to the student's homeless status

While we always want to be respectful of your privacy, state absence reporting law requires us to state the reason for the absence. Please note that family vacations are not excused absences, with some exceptions to be approved in advance (death or serious illness in the family, family wedding or graduation, etc.).

In addition to absences, all tardies and early releases need to be excused using the same reasons as absences. Please note the following:

- Arriving between 9:15 and 9:45 counts as a tardy.
- Arriving after 9:45 counts as a half-day absence.
- Leaving between 3:00 and 3:30 counts as a tardy.
- Leaving before 3:00 counts as a half-day absence.
