
Dear Parents.

Counselor's Corner

What Parents Should Know About Bullying

What is Bullying?

At Jefferson we use the Steps to Respect anti-bullying curriculum in grades 3-5. We also talk with students in K-2 in a less formal way about bullying. Children learn this definition: Bullying is unfair and one-sided. It happens when someone keeps hurting, frightening, threatening, or leaving someone out on purpose.

Bullying can take many forms, including pushing, kicking, and hitting, as well as name-calling, humiliation, and spreading rumors, and cyberbullying. It can have serious long-term effects for victims and bullies.

Parents can help by talking to your kids about bullying, even if you don't think they are victims. Ask how things are going at school. Ask what they think of the other kids in their classes. Ask if anyone gets picked on or bullied.

What If Your Child is a Victim of Bullying?

Give your child some ways to respond to bullying. We teach children to:

- Recognize know what bullying is.
- Refuse Say NO firmly, turn and walk away. Try not to show that she is angry or upset.
- Report to a teacher or other staff member.

As a parent, you can:

- Practice the above techniques with your child so he or she is prepared if an incident does occur.
- Let the school know. Talk with your child's teacher, counselor, and/or principal.
- Find a new activity for your child that will allow her to focus on things she likes or does well, and get her together with people who aren't connected with her bullying problems.

What about cyber bullying?

Cyber bullying can include threats, embarrassing or cruel rumors, harassment, and posting photos. You can take steps toward protecting your children from cyber bullying by teaching them that there are potential dangers on the internet and that they can be safer if they:

- Don't respond to or forward emails or messages that are mean or spread rumors
- Don't open emails or messages from someone they know bullies others
- Block messages from anyone who cyber bullies
- Save or print all bullying messages
- Show the messages to an adult they trust—like a parent or a teacher—and ask for help (if the first adult they tell doesn't help, they should keep telling until someone does)
- Never arrange to meet someone who is bullying them online
