Elementary Boundary Revision

Proposals Considered

- 1. Move 125-150 students from Woodside Elementary School to Silver Lake Elementary School
- ${\bf 2.\ Move\ 125\text{-}150\ students\ from\ Woodside\ Elementary\ School\ to\ Silver\ Firs\ Elementary\ School}$
- 3. Move 125-150 students from Woodside Elementary School to multiple elementary schools
- 4. No changes to middle or high schools

Elementary boundary revision

Silver Lake proposa

Move 125-150 students from Woodside ES to Silver Lake ES

EPS Rationale

*Provides relief to the elementary school most impacted by student growth

*Moves these students to the elementary school closest to their neighborhood and with the lowest current enrollment in the southern half of the district

*Fall 2015 implementation provides relief one year earlier than 2016

*Minimizes the impacts of changing boundaries across multiple Schools

Move approximately 125 – 150 elementary students from the northern portion of Woodside ES to Silver Lake ES, beginning in fall 2015. This move affects the Heatherwood, Reserve, and Hawthorne apartments, Nature's Landing condominiums, and the Woodside Walk neighborhood (projected to be 139 students)

This would be an interim (4-year) boundary plan until new permanent building space is constructed from 2016 bond funds (a new school would open in fall 2018 or 2019)
