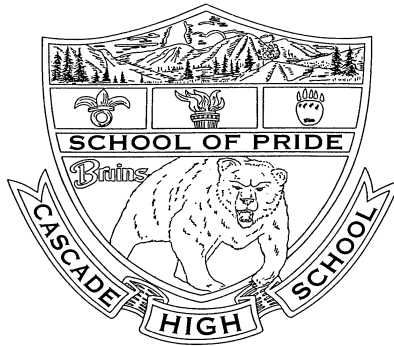

- **Register to vote!** Voter registration information and materials are available in an area in your school's main office. You can also register to vote online at <http://bit.ly/VoteRegistration>.
- **Access to public records** - Many records and documents in Everett Public Schools are available to the public. Parents and other citizens have the right to ask the school district to view or have copies made of records defined as "public" under state and federal laws including their own student's records and public records about discipline of school employees. Everett Public Schools public records requests are handled by the district's finance and business services office. Records can be requested by writing that office at PO Box 2098, Everett, WA 98213, sending an email to publicrecords@everettsd.org or calling 425-385-4150.
- **Your student's records are confidential** - Everett Public Schools takes very seriously its duty to protect student records and privacy. Student transcripts and other education-related records are protected by multiple security measures. Only those teachers, administrators and other staff members who work directly with the student and have an educational need to know about the student have access to individual student records. Staff members are expected to maintain confidentiality about information contained in a student's records.
- **Change to vaccination requirements** - Students in kindergarten through 12th-grade now need 2 doses of Varicella (chickenpox) vaccine or have a health care provider document that they have already had chickenpox. Review vaccination requirements for your child on this [one-page guide](#) from Washington State Department of Health.
- **Safety tip line** - Do you or your student have a concern about someone who may be experiencing bullying or harassment? Or perhaps heard a rumor about someone bringing a weapon or drugs to school? **Report it!** You can talk directly with your school's office or you can call, text or email your concern.

- **School breakfast prices increased by a quarter this fall.**

New prices will be:

Middle and high schools - \$1.50

Elementary schools - \$1.25

- **Student opportunities and activities eflyers** - We email approved flyers from community organizations to guardians through a system called [Peachjar](#). The flyers are also posted on each school's website. Look for the Peachjar button in the Quicklinks section of the school homepage to view flyers and register others who might also want to receive the flyers. 
- **Kids in Transition program in Everett Public Schools** - The Kids in Transition (KIT) program supports students who qualify as homeless under federal McKinney-Vento legislation. Students who lack a fixed, regular, or adequate nighttime residence may qualify. The KIT program works to eliminate barriers to students' academic success and extra-curricular participation. We ensure homeless students have school supplies and provide tutoring or facilitate student participation in extended day or summer school classes. We help students participate in activities such as sports or clubs by paying required fees. KIT provides transportation for eligible students to maintain school stability, as long as the commute is feasible. Last year, Everett Public Schools served over 1,100 homeless students at some time during the school year. - **ECEAP preschool accepting applications for 2016-17** - Everett Public Schools' Early Childhood Education & Assistance Program (ECEAP) is a FREE preschool program for three- and four-year-old children from families with limited income. ECEAP prepares children for kindergarten and provides family support and health and nutrition services. It is funded by the Washington State Department of Early Learning. The five ECEAP sites within our school district are Garfield, Hawthorne, Lowell, Madison and Silver Lake elementary schools. Space is limited – apply early! NEW AT CHS...LINK CREW!



This year is the first year of the new Link Crew program at Cascade High School. Link Crew is a freshmen transition program designed to pair up upper class mentors with the incoming freshmen in order to ensure social and academic success for their first year in high school. We currently have about 100 Link Leaders that consist of juniors and seniors, who have trained over the summer to be ready for the incoming freshmen.

The first event of the year was the freshmen orientation assembly, where we had over 80% of the freshmen class in attendance. Students were introduced to their peers, met their mentors, went on a campus tour, and were provided their schedules. The mentor relationship continued on the first day of school when the entire Link Crew group stood in the freshmen section during the opening assembly.

This program will provide continued support for the remainder of the school year, which will consist of social events, mentor check-ins, and academic support. We look forward to watching this program grow in the upcoming years!

PARENTING OUR TEENS



Do you ever feel like asking your teen, “Who are you and what have you done with my child?” Perhaps you’re wondering where that boy went to that used to tell you everything or the girl who wanted to hang out with you. Now that they’ve hit their teens, our role with them, although very important, has changed. In the words of Michael Riera, Ph.D, a leading authority on understanding teenagers, “the job of a parent of a teen is to get fired as our kids’ manager and to get rehired as their consultant.” Easier said than done though. How do we go from being the manager of our child’s life to letting go and coaching our son and daughter as they learn to take charge of their own lives? Whether they are 14 or 17, our hope for them is that they become caring and independent adults. We have a few short years to guide them before they launch out in the world. These adolescent years are a time of transition and can be both exciting and challenging for families.

To transition from manager to consultant does not mean “hands off” parenting. It does not mean that our job is done. Even though their peers are very important to teens, an involved, connected parent is shown to protect teens from many risky behaviors. Parenting a teen is an intentional type of parenting marked by listening, being available during the times they want to talk, asking them deep thinking questions and being on the side lines like a coach. Kids who believe they can seek the counsel of their parents are more likely to grow into caring, resilient adults.

Attendance Policies

Welcome to the 2016-2017 school year.

Please read the information below so you are aware of how Attendance is taken at the high school level as it differs from elementary/middle school level.

To excuse an absence or tardy,
please use the following e-mail address:

⇒ Written notes are required to excuse a student's absence from school.

A written note can be in the form of an email to chsattendance@everettsd.org or fax (425) 385-6002. Phone calls or voice mails will not excuse an absence or tardy.

Upon coming to school late or leaving early students are required to sign in and sign out of the Attendance Office. If a student is late to school, even if it is during passing time or lunch time, they are required to come to the Attendance Office to sign in and receive a pass to class.

Students are not allowed to leave school or meet a parent in the parking lot. For safety reasons, parents/guardians on record with the school must come into the Attendance Office to sign out their students.

If a student leaves school without permission and without signing out in the Attendance Office, their absences will remain **unexcused**.

Do NOT text or call your student during class to have them leave. Teachers do not allow students to leave unless the Attendance Office calls to authorize it.

⇒ Students must turn in their notes to excuse previous absences, early dismissals, bus notes, written by a parent, by 10:00 a.m. in the morning. If your student forgets to turn in their absence note, they are welcomed and encouraged to bring it the next morning.

Notes must be turned in within 48 hours after a student returns back to school, not including holidays or weekends, in order to have the absence excused. Notes turned in past 48 hours can still be turned in; however, the absence is not excused and will be coded with *LN* for late note.

- ⇒ **IF you receive a phone call saying your student was marked absent in a class** and they say to you, “I was there,” please contact the teacher directly about this discrepancy or have your students stop by the attendance office for a pink Attendance Correction Request slip. The student will need to take care of this with the teacher who marked them absent. The teacher is the only one that can give permission to change an absence that is deemed a “mistake” as they are the only one who can verify if a student was in class, in the wrong seat or tardy. The 48-hour rule does not apply for fixing these mistakes.
- ⇒ If your student is out of school **over 5 days due to illness, a doctor’s note is required to excuse the absence.** Homework can be requested for students out sick over 3 days. Please be aware that we require 24 hour’s notice to teachers for homework collection. You are welcome to email teachers directly to request schoolwork.
- ⇒ **Pre-Arranged absence:** If your student is going to be out of school due to vacations, surgeries, tournaments, appointments, etc..., a pre-arranged absence form is required. These forms are found on-line or in the attendance office. This must be filled out by the student and teachers and then signed by parent/guardian, student and principal and turned in at least 48 hours prior to the student’s absence.
- ⇒ **PLEASE know what time your student has lunch or is in a PE class. It is not possible to find your student during lunch and extremely difficult to find them during PE.** If you have to pick them up during either of these times, please send a note to the attendance office before school begins to pick up a pass that will allow them to meet you at the attendance office at the time specified.
- ⇒ **Students must sign in and out of the attendance office** if they arrive late or leave campus early.
- ⇒ Please remember that if your student missed the bus, overslept or is running late, or had car trouble, the absence **WILL NOT** be excused.
- ⇒ **The following are valid and acceptable excuses per the Everett School District Attendance Policy:**
