### 55TH ANNUAL FOOD & GIFT DRIVE CONTINUED

<u>Online Donations</u>: We received \$1,200 in online donations – including \$500 donated to Ms. Hunters class, \$250 to Staley's class, and several donations from alumni and former staff members.

### **CANS:** 72,561

### **CANNING:**

Students canned at 12 different stores for over 1,116 hours. If you consider that most students canned in pairs or groups of 3-4, the collective hours at the stores could be as high as 4464 hours -- that's 186 DAYS of CANNING!

**OTHER AWESOME THINGS:** We were the recipients of several very generous donations from our community businesses:

- An anonymous donor donated \$20 Safeway gift cards to each of our families a \$3500 donation
- Don, Jan and Megan Jensen donated 200 turkeys on behalf of the Brett Akio Jensen Memorial Scholarship fund
- ZUMIEZ Foundation- donated pallets full of winter jackets and blankets
- QFC Mill Creek- Loans us 150 shopping carts and coordinates the order of \$15,000+ worth
  of items that are guaranteed for each of our families, including: turkeys, toilet paper, paper
  towels, dish soap, stuffing, potatoes, onions, carrots, eggs, butter, bread, salt, cooking oil,
  toothpaste, and many more items
- \$100 donation from Dwayne Lane's
- \$1000 donation from BECU Mill Creek

### SHOPPING/DELIVERY DAY:

- THANK YOU to everyone for boxing and sorting your cans in your classrooms. This year, we finished sorting just after 2pm about 3 hours ahead of normal! Thank you, thank you!
- Over 300 students, 40+ alumni, and numerous staff boxed up food for 176 families, 67 of which are families of our Cascade students. This food required over 1,000 boxes.
- We sent nearly 20,000 pounds of excess food, gifts, and baby items to Volunteers of America, Mill Creek Food Bank, Salt of the Earth, Everett Gospel Mission, Hand in Hand and Sequoia High School.

### **DELIVERY DAY:**

160 students, 3 staff members, and about 25 alumni departed in 50 vehicles to deliver food to our 176 families. We had the gym cleaned and swept by 1pm, in time for athletics to use the gym.



- Kindergarten registration begins this month Do you have a child who will be 5 years old by Aug. 31, 2017? If "yes," these three dates are really important:
  - ⇒ Jan. 16, 2017 Get kindergarten registration materials online, or,
  - ⇒ Jan. 18, 2017 Get paper copies of kindergarten registration materials at elementary school offices
  - ⇒ Jan. 23, 2017 registration begins at all 17 district elementary schools
- Which school will your kindergartner attend? To find out, click on School and Route Finder under the Parents tab, or call the transportation office at 425-385-4144.
- January is School Board Appreciation month The month of January marks the annual observance of School Board Recognition a time to salute the work of school board members and celebrate public education. You can learn more about the new board members online.
- Smarter Balanced Assessments Because Smarter Balanced Assessments are such an important topic for families, the link to everything you ever wanted to know about these tests is in the *Quicklinks* section on the district home page.
- Support for students in temporary or inadequate housing If your family is in a temporary



or inadequate living situation due to a loss of housing or a family crisis, your child may be eligible for certain educational rights and services. If you lost your housing and now live in a shelter, motel, vehicle, camping ground, temporary trailer, on the street, doubled up with family or friends, or in another type of temporary or inadequate housing, your child might be able to receive help through a federal law called the McKinney-Vento Act. The McKinney-Vento Act may be able to provide support through transportation so that your child can continue enrolled in school, or through access to programs and services so that

# Attendance Policies

Welcome to the 2016-2017 school year.

Please read the information below so you are aware of how Attendance is taken at the high school level as it differs from elementary/middle school level.

To excuse an absence or tardy, please use the following e-mail address:

chsattendance@everettsd.org

⇒ Written notes are required to excuse a student's absence from school.

A written note can be in the form of an email to <a href="mailto:chsattendance@everettsd.org">chsattendance@everettsd.org</a> or fax (425) 385-6002. Phone calls or voice mails will not excuse an absence or tardy.

Upon coming to school late or leaving early students are required to sign in and sign out of the Attendance Office. If a student is late to school, even if it is during passing time or lunch time, they are required to come to the Attendance Office to sign in and receive a pass to class.

Students are not allowed to leave school or meet a parent in the parking lot. For safety reasons, parents/guardians on record with the school must come into the Attendance Office to sign out their students.

If a student leaves school without permission and without signing out in the Attendance Office, their absences will remain **unexcused**.

<u>Do NOT text or call your student during class to have them leave</u>. Teachers do not allow students to leave unless the Attendance Office calls to authorize it.

⇒ Students must turn in their notes to excuse previous absences, early dismissals, bus notes, written by a parent, by 10:00 a.m. in the morning. If your student forgets to turn in their absence note, they are welcomed and encouraged to bring it the next morning.

Notes must be turned in within 48 hours after a student returns back to school, not including holidays or weekends, in order to have the absence excused. Notes turned in past 48 hours can still be turned in; however, the absence is not excused and will be coded with *LN* for late note.

- ⇒ IF you receive a phone call saying your student was marked absent in a class and they say to you, "I was there," please contact the teacher directly about this discrepancy or have your students stop by the attendance office for a pink Attendance Correction Request slip. The student will need to take care of this with the teacher who marked them absent. The teacher is the only one that can give permission t change an absence that is deemed a "mistake" as they are the only one who can verify if a student was in class, in the wrong seat or tardy. The 48-hour rule does not apply for fixing these mistakes.
- ⇒ If your student is out of school <u>over 5 days due to illness, a doctor's note is required</u> to excuse the <u>absence</u>. Homework can be requested for students out sick over 3 days. Please be aware that we require 24 hour's notice to teachers for homework collection. You are welcome to email teachers directly to request schoolwork.
- ⇒ <u>Pre-Arranged absence</u>: If you student is going to be out of school due to vacations, surgeries, tournaments, appointments, etc..., a pre-arranged absence form is required. These forms are found on-line or in the attendance office. This must be filled out by the student and teachers and then signed by parent/guardian, student and principal and turned in at least 48 hours prior to the student's absence.
- ⇒ PLEASE know what time your student has lunch or is in a PE class. It is not possible to find your student during lunch and extremely difficult to find them during PE. If you have to pic them up during either of these times, please send a note to the attendance office before school begins to pick up a pass that will allow them to meet you at the attendance office at the time specified.
- ⇒ Students must sing in and out of the attendance office if they arrive late or leave campus early.
- ⇒ Please remember that if your student missed the bus, overslept or is running late, or had car trouble, the absence <u>WILL NOT</u> be excused.
- ⇒ The following are valid and acceptable excuses per the Everett School District Attendance Policy:
