Cascade High School Robotics Teams go to State Championship – Again!

Cascade High School Robotics Teams 6485 Bear Bots and 7342 Hibernotics go to State Championship! The Cascade Bruin Robotics Team 6485 Bear bots and 7342 Hibernotics of the Everett School District, a Boeing Sponsored Team went to the State championship at the Showare Center in Kent Washington on Feb 4th. This is the 4rd year in a row that at least 1 or our 2 FTC Teams has gone to the state

championship. But this year they are both going. Way to go, Bruins!

FIRST Tech Challenge (FTC). FTC is an exciting robotic based program that uses real world technology and programming. Geared towards High School students, it can act as a bridge between the popular FLL and the intense FRC. However students with no previous experience with FIRST or other technology can be successful. Using powerful DC motors and the new Tetrix system created by Pitsco it will allow for a wide range of exciting machines to be built. Robots will be designed to compete with an autonomous period as well as an operator controlled time. Maximum sizes for the machines are 18" by 18" by 18". They will compete on a 12 foot by 12 foot field.



Attendance Policies

Welcome to the 2016-2017 school year.

Please read the information below so you are aware of how Attendance is taken at the high school level as it differs from elementary/middle school level.

To excuse an absence or tardy, please use the following e-mail address:

⇒ Written notes are required to excuse a student's absence from school.

A written note can be in the form of an email to chsattendance@everettsd.org or fax (425) 385-6002. Phone calls or voice mails will not excuse an absence or tardy.

Upon coming to school late or leaving early students are required to sign in and sign out of the Attendance Office. If a student is late to school, even if it is during passing time or lunch time, they are required to come to the Attendance Office to sign in and receive a pass to class.

Students are not allowed to leave school or meet a parent in the parking lot. For safety reasons, parents/guardians on record with the school must come into the Attendance Office to sign out their students.

If a student leaves school without permission and without signing out in the Attendance Office, their absences will remain **unexcused**.

<u>Do NOT text or call your student during class to have them leave</u>. Teachers do not allow students to leave unless the Attendance Office calls to authorize it.

⇒ Students must turn in their notes to excuse previous absences, early dismissals, bus notes, written by a parent, by 10:00 a.m. in the morning. If your student forgets to turn in their absence note, they are welcomed and encouraged to bring it the next morning.

Notes must be turned in within 48 hours after a student returns back to school, not including holidays or weekends, in order to have the absence excused. Notes turned in past 48 hours can still be turned in; however, the absence is not excused and will be coded with *LN* for late note.

- ⇒ IF you receive a phone call saying your student was marked absent in a class and they say to you, "I was there," please contact the teacher directly about this discrepancy or have your students stop by the attendance office for a pink Attendance Correction Request slip. The student will need to take care of this with the teacher who marked them absent. The teacher is the only one that can give permission t change an absence that is deemed a "mistake" as they are the only one who can verify if a student was in class, in the wrong seat or tardy. The 48-hour rule does not apply for fixing these mistakes.
- ⇒ If your student is out of school <u>over 5 days due to illness</u>, a <u>doctor's note is required</u> to <u>excuse the absence</u>. Homework can be requested for students out sick over 3 days. Please be aware that we require 24 hour's notice to teachers for homework collection. You are welcome to email teachers directly to request schoolwork.
- ⇒ <u>Pre-Arranged absence</u>: If you student is going to be out of school due to vacations, surgeries, tournaments, appointments, etc..., a pre-arranged absence form is required. These forms are found on-line or in the attendance office. This must be filled out by the student and teachers and then signed by parent/guardian, student and principal and turned in at least 48 hours prior to the student's absence.
- ⇒ PLEASE know what time your student has lunch or is in a PE class. It is not possible to find your student during lunch and extremely difficult to find them during PE. If you have to pic them up during either of these times, please send a note to the attendance office before school begins to pick up a pass that will allow them to meet you at the attendance office at the time specified.
- ⇒ Students must sing in and out of the attendance office if they arrive late or leave campus early.
- ⇒ Please remember that if your student missed the bus, overslept or is running late, or had car trouble, the absence <u>WILL NOT</u> be excused.
- ⇒ The following are valid and acceptable excuses per the Everett School District Attendance Policy:

Hard to believe but we beginning to prepare for the 2017-2018 school year and we want you to be aware of our registration process.

A video outlining the entire registration process will be posted on the school website starting February 27th. Parents, we encourage you watch this video with your student. Students will watch this video in their PAWS class at which time they will also receive the 2017-2018 Course Catalog and Student Planning Guide.


Students will be assigned to a "Counselor Advisory Session" during a second period class between March 6th and March 28th. During this session, your student will have a chance to meet one-on-one with their counselor. There is no need for most students to schedule an individual appointment with a counselor regarding registration, as this will take place during their Counselor Advisory Session scheduled in March. If that session does not provide enough time for the student and counselor to plan adequately, the counselor will schedule an additional appointment.

Information about specific courses, including elective offerings and our expanding AP program, are examples of specific questions we would encourage students to have ready for their Counselor Advisory Session. In addition, these sessions are a good time for any questions about graduation requirements and/or courses that align to a student's post-high school plan. Elective and AP teachers are always willing to answer any questions about their programs as well. Students should feel free to talk to any of our teachers if they have specific questions about a course.

During our March 2nd Open House evening event, we will also have a chance for our teachers in electives and AP programs to share information about their courses and answer any questions you may have about them.

Students who wish to enroll in a specialty program such as Running Start or Sno-Isle, should still complete their registration process and sign up for classes at Cascade. After the Counselor Advisory Session, students will have chance to meet with their counselor to discuss enrolling in these off-campus programs.

Again, we encourage you sit down with your student and watch the online registration video, and to look through the 2017-2018 Student Planning Guide. We also look forward to seeing you for our March 2^{nd} Open House event.


