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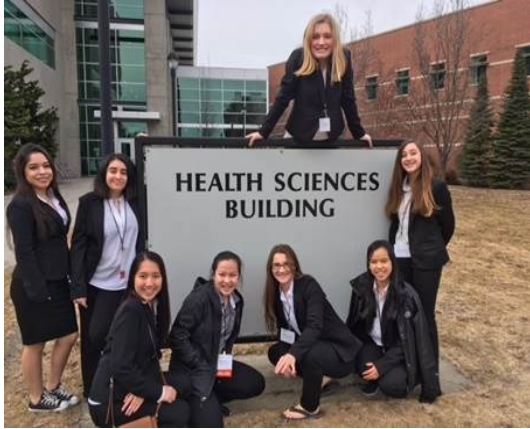

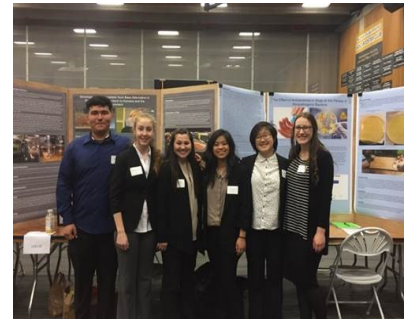
HOSA MEDICAL CAREERS CLUB

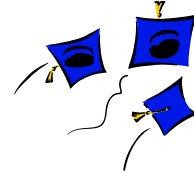

 - The Everett Public Schools Foundation Scholarship Award – awarded to a high school senior for excellence in the visual arts.

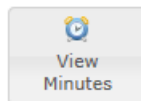
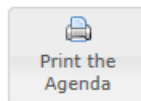
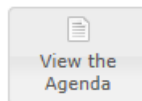

ATTENDANCE PROCEDURE UPDATE

Parents, did you know our attendance procedure has been updated?

Attending school each day is the first step to student success in school. Our state has recognized the importance of student attendance and through the state legislature revised our state law [RCW 28A.225](#) that concerns compulsory school attendance. These revisions are specific to the role and responsibility of the district concerning absenteeism and the resources available to assist students and families to correct absentee behaviors.

Following the revised state law, revisions to EPS [procedure 3122P, Attendance](#) were made to establish and support consistent attendance practices district-wide for excusing absences, recording absences, conducting meetings and communications with parents/guardians to discuss student absences, and parameters for pre-arranged absences for vacation or travel. Beginning March 27th, the revised [procedure 3122P, Attendance](#) was implemented in all schools.

We encourage parents to read the updated attendance procedure 3122P using the hyperlinks above or by using our [district policies and procedures webpage](#) or school attendance websites to become more familiar with the new changes. The revised and updated information for procedure 3122P will be included in the printed and online *Student Responsibilities and Rights* handbook and provided to students and parents for the 2017-18 school year.

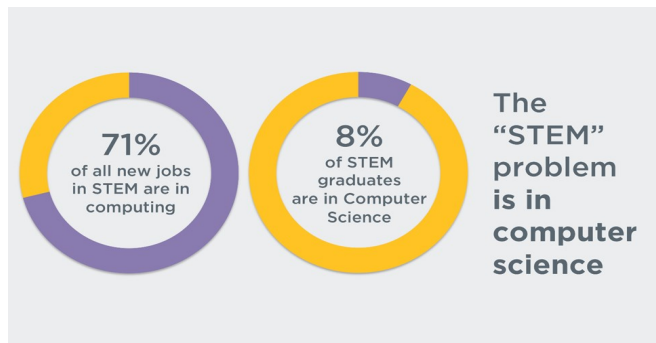
- **College remedial classes? Maybe not!**

High school juniors can eliminate the need for college remedial classes by earning a 3 or a 4 on the on the Smarter Balanced Assessment (SBA) this spring. A score of 3 or 4 in your junior year makes you eligible in college to move directly into credit-bearing college-level classes (at the 100 level and above) when you enroll at any of the state's 34 community and technical colleges, any of the public baccalaureate institutions and nine independent colleges. Just provide your Washington college or technical school a copy of your SBA scores once you are admitted.

AP COMPUTER SCIENCE COURSES!

Cascade High School teams up with Code.org to drastically increase the number of students taking AP Computer Science Courses.

There are two types of AP classes for students interested in computer science at CHS, AP Computer Science A (CSA) and AP Computer Science Principles (CSP). AP CSP is designed to be a first course in computer science, so it is open to all interested students having completed Algebra 1 with a C or better. The hope is we attract more female and minority students. CS Principles takes a broader approach around the fundamentals and it's programming languages is Java Script.





















The hope is that as more students take AP Computer Science Principles, more students will go on to take AP Compute Science A

AP Computer Science A is problem-solving oriented course and focuses specifically on Java. This course is equivalent to a first semester college class in programming. This class is taught in combination with professional software engineers who are in the class 4 of the 5 days of the week. The class also gets support from Microsoft, offering internships, field trips and AP practice sessions. Students should have passed Algebra 2 with a B or better. Both courses at Cascade also have an option for UW credit.
