

From the Principal:

Dear View Ridge Families,

Thank you all for attending Spring Conferences this week and I wish you all a very happy Spring Break! When we welcome students back on April 10th, we will take time a little time to review our expectations so we can be ready to tackle rich content and essential learning standards as students prepare for the end of the year and their next grade level! It's truly a busy, but fun time of the year as students continue to grow and bloom just like spring flowers!

Smarter Balanced Assessment (SBA): Soon after Spring Break we will begin our spring Smarter Balanced Assessment testing for students in grades 3-5. The SBA is a standardized test, which means that the test is provided in the same manner as much as possible for all students. The SBA is designed to determine the student's level of understanding of the academic standards the students are learning in the classroom daily. Because the administration is standardized and based on grade level academic standards, we can look at SBA results across grade levels, schools, and districts, to better direct funding, professional development, and curriculum changes. SBA results are an important part of pursuing educational equity. On an individual student basis, the SBA provides another piece of evidence to help teachers better understand how to adjust their curriculum and instruction to help individual students meet grade level standards.

The testing window opens on Aprill 11th and closes on June 9th. Students in grades 3-5 will complete the SBA Computer Adaptive Test (CAT) and Performance Task (PT) in both English Language Arts (ELA) and Mathematics. Fifth graders will also take the WA Comprehensive Assessment of Science (WCAS). Here is our testing schedule:



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You may also reach out to your teacher about testing times specific for your class. Students are encouraged to get plenty of rest the night before testing and eat breakfast and lunch the day of. Students may use their own personal, wired headsets during testing. Boundary change: On Tuesday, March 28th, the board approved an adjustment to school attendance boundaries between Everett Public Schools' Lowell Elementary and View Ridge Elementary. This change will only affect the boundaries of an area on the west side of Evergreen Way between 75th Street SE and East Casino Road. This boundary change is necessary to move elementary students living in this area (currently 13 families live in this area), plus an estimated two hundred new elementary students that are expected to move into the 430 multi-family unit Four Corners housing development under construction on the old Kmart site, from Lowell Elementary School to View Ridge Elementary School. The development will be opened in phases over time over the 2023-24 school year and into the summer of 2024. In the presentation to the board, this recommendation was shared based on several considerations including the fact that Lowell Elementary School is over capacity and our school is under capacity. As the principal at View Ridge for the past seven years, I have seen our enrollment grow to almost 600 students and decline to about 470 students. With the region now growing again, I am looking forward to the opportunities that adding new families and students will bring to our school community. I also know that with change comes a lot of unknown, which can spark questions and even concerns. I am inviting all View Ridge community members to attend a meeting with me, our Regional Superintendent, Dr. Cathy Woods, and Executive Director of Facilities & Operations, Mr. Mike Gunn, on April 13th at 6 pm to discuss this change as well as to hear your hopes, questions, and concerns. I appreciate your partnership and support as we focus on building our community together.

Regular school attendance is important, and we will work with you to ensure your child is present to benefit from an excellent education. If your student is absent or tardy from school, please email every day the attendance office at vreattendance@everettsd.org or call at 425-385-5405 to let us know the reason for the absence or tardy.



If email is not possible, and even if you leave a message with the school attendance line, please send a written note to the school office within 30 days after your student returns to school.


- Absences must be reported (by email or note) within 30 days after a student return back to school, not including Holidays or weekends, in order to have the absence excused. Emails or notes turned in past the 30-day timeframe will be accepted; however, the absence is not excused and will be coded as such.
- Automated attendance calls will be sent out daily at 10 a.m. If your student will be absent or tardy you must notify the office before 9:15 a.m. If it is reported after this time, you may receive the automated call.
- Please view the Everett School District Attendance Procedure 3122P for more information
- Did you have a medical appointment for your child, or they were sick, and you brought them to the doctor? If so, make sure to ask for a medical note from the provider. Email the note to the attendance office so those absences can be coded as a medical note excused absence.
- Please fill out a <u>Prearranged Absence Form</u> if your student will be going on vacation/traveling or will miss school for an extended period of time. As per district policy, the principal or designee may excuse up to five (5) school days.

 Students are immersed in the Spanish language and culture with the majority of instruction being in Spanish.

 Priority will be given to students within the Emerson Elementary school attendance area. If a high number of students apply, a lottery will be conducted to select students.
- Port Gardner Family Partnership K-12 located on Sequoia High School Campus

 Port Gardner K-12 is a parent partnership program, where parents/guardians are the primary educators of their
 children. Our program is a blend of on-site classes taught by certificated teachers, and remote classes taught by
 parents/guardians in the home.


