#### ATTENDANCE

Please **EMAIL** <u>CWEAttendance@everettsd.org</u> or **CALL** and leave a voicemail message at (425) 385-7705 for any absences, this includes if your child will be coming to school late or leaving school early. It is recommended to include the teacher in your email. The school office is very busy in the morning getting students and staff ready for the school day – emails and voicemails are very appreciated!!!

### **Reunification simulation held**



Thursday October 6 district staff, community volunteers and 4 busloads of students and staff from Jackson High School participated in a reunification drill. The drill was an important part of practicing and testing the reunification plans of the district in case a school needs to be evacuated. Memorial Stadium serves as the reunification location for the entire district and the drill is practiced every two years, except during remote learning.
