
2019 Summer School

Monroe Memos

Dear Families.

In April, I will be wrapping up the Second Step lessons in grades K-2. Students have worked very hard to explore and learn this sometimes-difficult subject area. I am proud of each one of these students, but more importantly, each student should be proud of themselves for their hard work. Below is an overview of what they have learned:

- Skills for Learning Students learned the following skills to help themselves learn:
 - Focus attention eyes watching, ears listening, body still, voice quiet.
 - Listen carefully use eyes, ears and brain.
 - Use self-talk to stay on task Say, "I can do this."
 - Be assertive when asking for what you want or need.
- 2. Empathy Students first learned to identify and understand their own feelings. Empathy is feeling or understanding what someone else is feeling. They learned compassion is empathy in action. When your student sees someone having a strong feeling, he/she may think some of the following things:
 - Look at her face and body for clues.
 - What is her point of view?
 - How does he feel?
 - What is a kind thing to say?
 - How can I help?
- Emotion Management Students learned specific skills for calming down when experiencing strong feelings, such as anxiety or anger.
 - Say, "Stop."
 - Name your feeling "I feel _____."
 - Take a belly breath, count, use positive self-talk, or use a breathing ball.
 - Now, they are ready to problem-solve.
- Problem Solving Students learned a process called S.T.E.P. to solve positively problems with others.
 - Say the Problem, without blame.
 - Think of Solutions that are safe and respectful.
 - Explore the Consequences; what could happen if?
 - Pick the best Solution; make a plan.

There are several problem-solving stations set up around the school. Students are able to use these stations to refer to the problem-solving poster and work to solve their problems independently, with peers, and with adult support when needed. Please encourage your children to utilize these stations when they have problems. Doing so will help your child practice and build confidence to be able to solve problems on their own!

I will continue to teach K-2 students in May and June; however, the focus will be a bit different. Thank you for sharing your wonderful students with me.


Kindergarten registration happening now
