Dear Families,

Unfortunately, I am needed elsewhere in the building to support students in learning. Therefore, I will no longer be teaching Social Emotional Skills to 3rd grade or Mrs. Nelson's 2/3 split class. I very much enjoyed working with those students and will miss our time together. Miss Debi, our school counselor, will be taking over teaching those critical skills for me.

In grades K-2, we will be focusing on empathy this month. Empathy is a key ingredient in the development of pro-social behaviors and interpersonal problem-solving skills. It is necessary for social-emotional competence and contributes to academic success. Being able to identify, understand, and respond in a caring way to how someone is feeling provides the foundation for helpful and socially responsible behaviors, friendships, cooperation, coping, and conflict resolution, all of which help students succeed in school.

Students with higher levels of empathy and its related skills and behaviors are more likely to be:

- · Academically successful
- Accepted by peers
- Socially skilled
- Less aggressive
- Emotionally supportive to others

Students with lower Levels of empathy and its related skills and behaviors are at greater risk for:

- Lower academic achievement
- Peer rejection
- Classroom discipline problems

The gift of attendance

Absences spike in the weeks before and after the winter holiday as families squeeze in a few more vacation days. Just a few missed days here and there, even excused absences, can add up to too much lost learning time and put your child behind in school. This is as true in kindergarten as it is in high school. Put simply, too many absences at any age can affect a student's chances for academic success and eventually for graduation. This holiday season, give your children the gift of an education and the habit of attendance.

Graduation rates jump to 95.7%

Parent safety tip

Before you take your child to a friend's sleepover or party, make sure you know a few important things first.

- Find out about the friend's "house rules" and who else will be at home, like parents, another adult, brothers, or sisters.
- Ask about what they plan to do during the visit.
- Talk with your child about things that are important to you: no guns, violent TV and video games, alcohol, tobacco, and other
 drugs. Take this time to review behaviors that are healthy and those that are dangerous.
- If your child does not have his or her own cell phone, be sure to have the telephone number of where he or she can be reached.
- If there is a change of plans, you need to be told.

Get to know other parents

- Talk with them on the phone.
- Meet them at neighborhood or school events.
- Greet them when dropping your child off at their home.

Communication is key

School-aged children need and want more independence. Good communication, with clear expectations, helps parents and children trust that what is going on is safe.
