Greetings Monroe families,

In addition, please do not schedule appointments and avoid absences, if possible, during the testing window.

As always, we ask that you pay special attention to information that is coming home in your child's folder. This time of year is filled with fun activities and important dates, and we don't want anyone to miss anything!

As you know, we are using the *Second Step* program in your child's classroom. This program teaches children important skills for getting along with others and doing well in school. It also helps our school be a safe and supportive place where everyone can learn.

To help make our school even more safe and supportive, we are going to use the *Second Step* Child Protection Unit. In these lessons, students will learn skills such as personal safety and assertiveness. Your child will bring home *Home Links* to help you understand what he or she is learning about safety at school and to give your child another chance to practice safety skills.

Dear Intermediate Families,

As we prepare for SBA testing this month, we would like to share with you some tips to help your student feel ready to do his or her best.

**The night before:** help your student go to bed on time; keep routines as normal as possible; mention the test to show interest without dwelling on it; and, plan ahead to have a smooth start on the day of the test.

The morning of the test: get up early to avoid rushing; arrive to school on time; make sure your child has a good breakfast; and, be positive about the test, reminding your student that doing his or her best is what counts.

**After the test:** talk with your child about his or her feelings about the test; discuss what was easy and what was hard; and, ask what your child learned from the test.

Together, we can ensure our students will feel prepared and proud of the effort they put into the testing process.

- AFTER you change that password, you will have access to your student's information.

# Summer school registration is open!

Registration materials are now online. Summer programs for high school students include opportunities to strengthen the skills and knowledge required for the district core expectations, repeat courses, extend their interests in academic areas, and take new courses. Tuition-based summer programs are offered for students through Online High School and at Cascade High School. Elementary and middle school summer programs are available for specific students who need academic support.

Following the board's decision, the district will communicate directly with families who will be affected by the high school boundary changes.
