Monroe Memos

In grades K-3, your students have been introduced to emotion management skills. Teaching students to recognize strong feelings and use calming-down steps to stay in control are effective ways to increase coping, as well as reduce aggression and other problem behaviors. Students are taught proactive strategies to help prevent strong feelings from turning into negative behaviors. When intense feelings are allowed to escalate, strong physiological reactions hamper students' ability to reason and to solve interpersonal and other problems without aggression. The ability to keep strong emotions from escalating and driving behavior allows students the chance to employ many other skills, such as effective communication, assertiveness, negotiation, compromise and problem solving.

Students with the skills to manage strong emotions, such as anger, anxiety, embarrassment, fear, and jealousy are more likely to:

- Get along with peers and make good choices
- Cope with strong emotions and express them in socially acceptable ways
- Be successful in school

Students with less-effective emotion-management skills are more likely to:

- Be aggressive
- Abuse substances
- Have decreased levels of social-emotional competence
- Have difficulty behaving in socially skilled ways
- Act impulsively on their emotions



Did you miss a call from us?

If missed a call from your school, please first check your voice mail or your email for the message rather than calling the school. Schools are often inundated with phone calls from parents after they send an automated call and cannot answer all of the calls.

Slight calendar change

There is a slight change to the school year calendar. **Friday, June 7** will be a 2.5 early release for all students to allow teachers time to complete grading. **Friday, June 14** will be a 75-minute early release for Learning Improvement Friday. The updated <u>year-at-a-glance</u> and <u>student art</u> calendars are available online if you'd like to print them for your reference. The <u>district website calendar</u> is also a convenient, up-to-date reference that integrates with the <u>district mobile app</u>. If you have the mobile app, you have the most current district and school calendar dates.

School performance report

Our school's performance report is available online on each school's website. More information is available on the <u>Office of</u> <u>Superintendent of Public Instruction website</u>. Click on "State Report Card" and select Everett from the list of districts.

Did you know that our district has the highest English Learner graduation rate in Washington state? And our student assessment scores last year outperformed the state's average assessment scores **in every subject**! Students are working hard in their learning, and staff are providing students with the targeted, coordinated supports they need to excel.

Is your family prepared?

Does your family have a plan in case of bad weather, school closure or delay? Who will pick up your student, if needed? How will you communicate if phone lines are jammed? Do you have needed emergency supplies in your car and at home?

Online safety tips

- Keep the computer in a busy area of your home.
- Use an app to keep an eye on your child's online activity on their device.
- Talking about cyberbullying; ask if someone they know has been a victim. Ask if they have been victimized.
- Set up email and social media accounts with your children. Know their screen names and passwords and explain the reasons for not including any personal information in profiles.
- Know who is in the "buddy lists." Get to know the cyberfriends as well as you do those who visit your home.
