
Our Community

Spanning 39 square miles, Everett Public Schools serves the educational needs of 19,606 students throughout their 27schools. As the tenth largest school district in Washington State based on the number of families and children living in our district. Located in one of the state's fastest growing areas in the state, the district enjoys a diversified economic base. Currently, the district consists of four high schools, five middle schools, and eighteen elementary schools utilizing a K-5, 6-8, 9-12 gradelevel configuration. The student body is culturally diverse with a student population that is 23.3% Hispanic, 4.8% African American, 57.8% White and 6.2% Asian, .7%

Our School

Everett High School is a comprehensive fouryear public high school enrolling nearly 1,600 students in grades 9–12. Built in 1909, Everett High School's main building was placed on the National Registry of historic places after extensive renovation in 1995. Everett High students attend classes in the Little Theater, Everett Civic Auditorium, gymnasium, cafeteria and science buildings. Everett High's central location and modern facilities are frequent sites for community, state and national events. Everett school colors are blue and gold, with the mascot a seagull.



Curriculum

Students at Everett High School earn 6.0 credits per year. The school year is divided into two semesters with six classes offered daily each worth 0.5 credit. A total of 24 credits are required to receive an Everett High School diploma for the class of 2023. OnlineHS classes may be incorporated into the school day or, for a fee, may be taken to gain more than 6.0 credits during the school year. Local colleges and universities offer credit options for our students and the Sno-Isle Skills Center is available for students seeking vocational curriculum. At Everett High School in addition to college level courses through Running Start, Dual Credit, College in the High School and Advanced Placement classes are offered.

Everett High School celebrates being Top 5% of schools, with similar demographics, for the number of AP exams taken and number of students enrolled in AP classes. EHS is recognized for equitable access enrollment across student diversity demographics.


