The Community

Spanning 39 square miles, Everett Public Schools serves the educational needs of over 20,000 students throughout their 26 schools. As the 14th largest school district in Washington State, it is located in one of the state's fastest growing areas, and the district enjoys a diversified economic base. Currently, the district's 26 schools include four high schools (grades 9-12), five middle schools (grades 6-8), and 17 elementary schools (grades K-5) with a culturally diverse student population.

The School

Henry M. Jackson High School (JHS) is a comprehensive four-year public school founded on the belief that all students can learn to a high standard. Opened in 1994 in the rapidly growing community of Mill Creek south of Everett, Jackson graduated its first senior class in 1997 and has grown to approximately 2,300 students. Since its inception, students, staff, and parents have collaboratively developed the academic curriculum, guided by state and national laws.

Advanced Placement Results:

- In 2017-18, 611 students took a total of 1,109 AP exams.
- 73.6% of the AP exams taken by JHS students received qualifying scores of 3 or higher.

Curriculum

Students at Henry M. Jackson High School earn 6.0 credits per year. The school year is divided into two semesters with six classes offered daily, each worth 0.5 credit. For the class of 2019, a total of 22 credits are required to receive a Henry M. Jackson High School diploma. Online High School classes may be incorporated into the school day or, for a fee, may be taken to gain more than 6.0 credits during the school year. Local colleges and universities offer credit options for our students, and the Sno-Isle Skills Center is available for students seeking vocational curriculum. Students can access honors and Advanced Placement classes at JHS in addition to college-level courses through Running Start, Tech Prep, and College in the High School.

Grading, GPA, Rank

- Grade point averages (GPAs) are cumulative and computed at the close of each semester.
- Grades are recorded on the transcript and the GPA is computed in late January and June.
- Only courses with letter grades are calculated in the GPA
- Jackson High School does not rank students but provides a decile standing.
- GPA is based on the traditional 4-point scale (at right).
- · JHS does not weight grades.
- All subjects are included in determination of decile standing and GPA including College in the High School and Running Start.
