## Your child is invited to attend

- Students currently in 2nd, 3rd, and 4th grades who are not yet at standard are invited to attend based on specific criteria by grade level.
- Students who are English learners are invited to attend based on their ELPA scores.
- Teachers will invite students who are eligible based on their reading, math, and/or ELPA scores.

## When and where?

- Mondays through Thursdays, August 9 - 26.
- Classes will be held at twelve schools.
- Summer school location will be determined based on the student's 2020 - 21 school.
- *There is no class on Fridays.*

## What about meals and transportation?

- Free breakfast and lunch are included for all students.
- Transportation will be provided from several pick up sites.

## What does it cost?

Elementary Summer Experience is free, paid through state and federal grants funding.

## What will my child do each day?

Elementary Summer Experience will provide your child with instruction in reading, writing, math, and science. The daily schedule includes 60 minutes of science, 60 minutes of reading and writing in small groups, 60 minutes of math, and 15 minutes of Second Step social skills. Students will participate in a variety of engaging and fun activities that will build their vocabulary and improve their skills. Math content will focus on number sense, place value, and operations and algebraic thinking. Students will have access to the school library for weekly book checkout to encourage summer reading. The class will have approximately 15 students with one teacher and para-educator support.

## Why should my child attend?

Your child will receive small group, focused instruction in key skills for success in the coming year. Your child will have fun learning and exploring!
