From the Principal

Welcome to October! It has been a great first month to kick-off the 2023-24 school year, and your children have been hard working, engaged, and passionate learners. Thank you for your support in helping to ensure that your child has a successful start to the new school year. Thank you for attending our Back-to-School Orientation, Meet the Teacher Day, September PTA meeting, and Curriculum Night & Book Fair Family Night. Your support always matters!

Social and emotional learning (SEL) is critical for student success, and this has never been truer than it is today. Whittier third through fifth grade students will be taking the Panorama Social and Emotional Learning survey next week. The survey prompts students to reflect on their own actions and thoughts as well as their overall experience at our school. Survey data will help school staff create a more positive school experience for all students as well as provide specific support for students in need. The results from these surveys will be shared with pre-approved adults who work closely with your children in the school. SEL data, alongside academic and attendance information, will allow adults to provide specific and targeted interventions as needed to support students succeeding at school. Whittier 5th grade students went to Camp Killoqua this week! It is such an amazing outdoor learning experience for our 5th grade students every year to have this opportunity to be able to attend camp. Thank you, Whittier families for your support every year to ensure that all students can participate in outdoor camp. Our PTA raised over \$22,000 at the end of the 2022-23 school year in the APEX Fun Run Fundraiser, and this fundraising money goes right back into our school programs to serve our students and school. A portion of the funds raised helps to support all 5th grade students having the opportunity to attend camp every year. Thank you!

Whittier's fall parent/teacher conference week will take place Monday, November 13 through Friday, November 17 (two weeks later than past years). You will have the opportunity to meet with your child's teacher to find out about their individual progress, learn about the remarkable things happening in your child's classroom, and find out how to support your child at home while working in partnership with your child's teacher. You will be receiving more information from your child's teacher at the end of October to set up a specific conference time meeting.

Finally, I wanted to emphasize to parents that student safety is the highest priority at Whittier. Please remember that the Whittier campus doors are locked until 8:15 a.m. Please do not drop your child off by themselves before 8:15 a.m. as we do not have supervision for students outside of the entrance or outside of the playground fence area in the morning. And for parents dropping their child off in the parking lot in the morning, please make sure the student drop-off point is at the entrance of the building in front of the office so students can immediately step onto the sidewalk at the office entrance. Please do not drop your child off in the parking lot loop as it is not safe for students to walk through the parking lot between cars to enter the building. Thank you for your support.

Our students are off to a great start in demonstrating "*The Whittier Way*" expectations to *Be Safe*, to *Be Respectful*, and to *Be Your Best*. Parents, thank you for your continued support in making Whittier a great place to learn. Let's make it an outstanding October!

IMPORTANT INFORMATION: SCHOOL ATTENDANCE

Welcome Whittier Families!



Please read below for essential information regarding school attendance.

- ALL families must report student absences to the Whittier OFFICE.
 You may report an absence one of two ways:
- Call the Attendance Line at 425-385-4305 and leave a voicemail.
- 2. Send an email to WHEAttendance@everettsd.org

It is great to notify your teacher of an absence, but **the only way to excuse an absence is by contacting the office.**

• To excuse an absence, a parent/guardian must provide a reason.

(Examples: illness, mental health day, travel, doctor appt, etc.)

- Students arriving after 8:35 AM are tardy and must check-in at the office for a pass.
- Students arriving after 9:05 AM are considered absent and must check-in at the office for a pass.
 A parent/guardian must provide a reason to excuse the partial day absence.
- Students are granted up to 5 excused days each school year for travel/vacation. Complete and return the Prearranged Absence Form to the office BEFORE your trip.






Let's Connect


Please see the school feeder pattern for each region's session and the graphic below to determine the schools in each region.

Safety reminders

As mornings become darker and darker, drivers, please keep an eye out for students walking and waiting at their bus stops. Families, please have your students wait for the bus to come to a complete stop and the flashing lights and stop sign to be fully out before they cross the street. Here is great graphic showing when to stop for school buses, and if you are ever in doubt--STOP! Other safety reminders include:

- Students and parents should wait on the curb when waiting for the school bus, not off the curb or in the street.
- Do not stand in school crosswalks, obey crossing guards if present.
- Be focused and aware when walking in school parking lots. We encourage walkers to stay
 off their cell phones while walking. Dark mornings may make it difficult for drivers to see
 walkers.
- Bicyclist must abide by the same laws as drivers, which means they must stop for school buses when applicable.
- If possible, wear lighter clothing/coats or add something reflective on darker clothing.

High School & Beyond events

Everett Public Schools is holding High School & Beyond events this month.

Students and families will be able to connect with colleges, universities, trade schools and apprenticeships from Washington and other states. Washington-specific schools will be highlighted, including our local community colleges. The number of college and career representatives available to support our efforts continues to grow, and we are looking forward to providing access to these rich, personalized resources to our students and families.



To increase access to each unique school community, the three comprehensive high schools have collaborated to provide a customized format on three specific dates in October as follows:

- Cascade HS | October 4, 2023 | 6-7:30 p.m. | Gym
 - o The college and career fair will take place during the curriculum night event
- Jackson HS | October 11, 2023 | 5:30-7:35 p.m. | Gym & Main Building
 - o The college and career fair will be a stand-alone evening event with several break-out session options
- Everett HS | October 24, 2023 | 9 a.m.-12:30 p.m. (families are invited to attend from 11 a.m.-12:30 p.m.) | Gym
 - o The college and career fair will take place during the school day

Details will be available on each of the high schools' homepages. If a family is not able to attend their school's event on the designated date, they are welcome to attend the HS & Beyond event at one of the other two high schools.

Interpreters from prominent languages of each school will be on site.

GoFan ticketing for school sports and activities!



GoFan, a digital ticketing and promotional service designed for school sports and activities, is available to all community members for in-person or advanced purchase at Memorial Stadium and paid events at each high school. The service provides more access and visibility to the district's ticketed events by offering payment by credit card through their platform, allowing users to view and subscribe to upcoming events and empowering the district with various tools. In-person cash payments are still available, and students with ASB cards receive free admission to sporting events.

The opportunity to pay by credit card at the ticketing window will reduce the amount of cash handling and prevent patrons from needing to leave for an ATM when they do not arrive with cash. There will be no direct cost to the district as GoFan charges \$1.00 + 3 percent as a convenience fee to the purchaser and all equipment required has been provided complimentary to each high school and Memorial Stadium. The equipment also utilizes cellular connectivity so it will require no additional infrastructure for implementation. By partnering with GoFan, the district will be able to increase accessibility to school events, increase participation and increase community involvement.
