ECEAP preschool accepting applications for 2023-24



Everett Public Schools Early Childhood Education & Assistance Program (ECEAP) is a FREE preschool program for three- and four-year-old children from families with limited income. ECEAP prepares children for kindergarten and provides family support and health and nutrition services. It is funded by the Washington State Department of Children, Youth and Families (DCYF).

The six ECEAP sites within our school district are Cedar Wood, Hawthorne, Jackson, Lowell, Madison and Silver Lake elementary schools. Students across the district are welcome to attend. Smarter Balanced Assessments and Washington Comprehensive Assessment of Science testing

High School English Language Arts and Math Smarter Balanced Assessments (SBA) will be held on May 23 and 25. Students in grade 10 are required to participate. Students in grades 11-12 may also participate for Graduation Pathway purposes. Students in grade 11 will participate in the Washington Comprehensive Assessment of Science (WCAS). **These tests simply help give teachers an accurate picture of whether students are on track to be ready for college or career. Students are encouraged to do their best!**




Safety tip line
