From the Counselor's

How To Talk To Your Child About Anxiety

Anxiety is what we feel in our mind and our body when our worries hang around a lot. Sometimes we might have a reason to feel anxious, other times, we may not know why. When we start to feel anxious, we might notice changes or reactions in our bodies. Sometimes our body might tell us that we feel anxious before our mind does, which is why we call these reactions body clues. When we notice these clues, we can start thinking about different strategies to deal with them.

Common body clues when we feel anxious:

- Tense shoulders
- Dizziness
- Headache
- Shaking

- Faster heart beat
- Nervous/upset stomach
- Faster breathing
- Sweating
- Weak legs

Strategies for Anxiety:

- Using positive self-talk
- Deep breathing
- Writing or drawing about your feelings
- · Talking about your thoughts and feelings
- Using your five senses
- Exercise
- Create a countdown plan for events that are coming up

During the month of May, the 3rd-5th grade students will be taking the SBA assessment. Test taking can cause a mixture of feelings including anxiety. Here are some helpful tips to help your child reduce test anxiety:

Night Before a Test:

- Get some exercise
- Eat a good meal
- Prepare for the morning
- · Give your brain a break
- Set your alarm

Morning Before a Test:

- · Wake up your mind and body
- Eat a healthy breakfast
- Positive self-talk
- Focus and calm yourself on arrival

Strategies to Reduce Test Anxiety:

- Positive Self-Talk "I can do this!", "I am smart and capable".
- Visualization Close your eyes and picture yourself doing well on the test.
- Deep Breathing take a slow deep breath in through your nose and out through your mouth.

ECEAP preschool accepting applications for 2023-24



Everett Public Schools Early Childhood Education & Assistance Program (ECEAP) is a FREE preschool program for three- and four-year-old children from families with limited income. ECEAP prepares children for kindergarten and provides family support and health and nutrition services. It is funded by the Washington State Department of Children, Youth and Families (DCYF).

The six ECEAP sites within our school district are Cedar Wood, Hawthorne, Jackson, Lowell, Madison and Silver Lake elementary schools. Students across the district are welcome to attend. Smarter Balanced Assessments and Washington Comprehensive Assessment of Science testing

High School English Language Arts and Math Smarter Balanced Assessments (SBA) will be held on May 23 and 25. Students in grade 10 are required to participate. Students in grades 11-12 may also participate for Graduation Pathway purposes. Students in grade 11 will participate in the Washington Comprehensive Assessment of Science (WCAS). These tests simply help give teachers an accurate picture of whether students are on track to be ready for college or career. Students are encouraged to do their best!

Teacher Appreciation Week is May 8-12 this year and not May 1-5 as printed in the Student Art Calendar. This week is also Substitute Educator Week as well!




Community Resource Fair

Standard Reunification Process




