## From the Counseling Department

### FAFSA Season Is Upon Us, FINALLY!

Sometime in December the FAFSA will become live and families can apply for financial aid for college. The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) is an office of the U.S. Department of Education. FAFSA coordinates with postsecondary schools and financial institutions to help students and families pay for college. In previous years the FAFSA was live October 1, but it has been revamped for this year and will open sometime in “by December 31.” Everett Public Schools recommends that every high school senior should apply for the FAFSA regardless of perceived eligibility. Many colleges/universities won’t even give merit-based scholarships unless the FAFSA has been completed. To complete the FAFSA families should go to <https://studentaid.gov/h/apply-for-aid/fafsa> to get started.

### WAFSA

Some of our students are not eligible to file a FAFSA due to a number of reasons, including immigration status. In these situations it may still be possible to receive state-based financial aid for college. Families should go to <https://wsac.wa.gov/wasfa> to find out more information and see if they are eligible.

## From the Career Center

### Field Trip for IEP/504 and Students with Disability

On Thursday, February 15, there will be a field trip sponsored by the Dept. of Vocational Rehabilitation (DVR) and the Northwest Educational Service District 189 for our **IEP, 504, and students with a disability**. Students will tour three locations on this trip:

- 1) **Lake Washington Institute of Technology** – programs (Baking/Culinary Arts, Welding, Design & Digital Gaming, Architectural Technology, Machining Technology & Mechanical Design, Nursing, and Auto Body/Auto Body Repair)
- 2) **Western WA Sheet Metal JATC** – business location (to explore possible apprenticeship careers with on-the-job training and classroom study)
- 3) **Cascade Boys & Girls Club** – to learn about 40-, 80-, or 120-hour paid internships for students 16 years and older. Last summer over 30 businesses partnered with Everett Public Schools to provide paid internships.

The field trip form, information, and parent letter are available in the Career Center. Students and parents need to complete and submit to the Career Center (1) a field trip form AND (2) a Pre-Employment Transition Services (Pre-ETS) form. **Parents:** We ask that you review and submit the linked DVR Pre-ETS consent form if your child would like to attend this field trip and wishes to participate in future tours and/or paid internships in 2024. ## College in the High School

Starting with the 2023-24 school year, there is **no cost** to students in grades 9 through 12 at public high schools to enroll in College in the High School (CiHS). CiHS programs provide college-level courses in high schools to qualified students. The students are able to earn both high school and postsecondary credit by completing postsecondary-level courses with a passing grade. To earn college credit, students are required to register on or before the registration deadlines set by the college. Registration for college credit occurs at the beginning of the college course or content. JHS offers a variety of CiHS courses through Everett Community College and a few through the University of Washington. For more information on registering:

## 2023 AP School Honor Roll

Congratulations to our three comprehensive high schools—Jackson, Cascade, and Everett—for receiving [2023 AP School Honor Roll](#) recognition! The AP School Honor Roll recognizes schools whose AP programs are delivering wide-reaching results for their students.

For a school to be recognized on the AP School Honor Roll, it must meet each of the following criteria anchored in research-based relationships between AP and college outcomes:

- **College Culture:** 40% or more of graduating cohort took at least one AP exam during high school.
- **College Credit:** 25% or more of the graduating cohort scored a 3 or higher on at least one AP exam during high school.
- **College Optimization:** 2% or more of the graduating cohort took five or more AP exams during high school. At least one of those exams was taken in 9th or 10th grade, so that students are spreading their AP experience across grades rather than feeling disproportionate pressure in any single year.

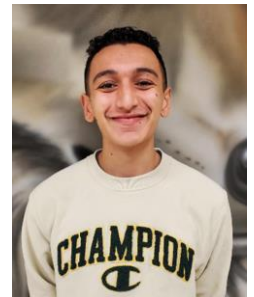
### Ethan Holmes, 11th | Cross-Country, Varsity

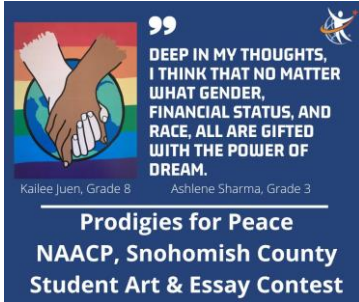

## Guaranteed Admissions Program



Everett Public Schools (EPS) is in its second year partnering with the Washington Guaranteed Admissions Program (WAGAP), which guarantees admission to Central Washington University, Eastern Washington University, The Evergreen State College, Saint Martin's University, University of Washington Tacoma, Washington State University, and Western Washington University, and its first year partnering with the Automatic Admissions Partnership, which guarantees admission to Pacific Lutheran University to help students meet their college and career goals.

To be eligible for guaranteed admissions to the eight participating institutions, students must have or be on track to earn by graduation a 3.0 GPA (3.3 for Pacific Lutheran University) and complete the college academic distribution requirement coursework.

The primary objective of this collaboration is to reach students who may have never contemplated pursuing a college education or didn't consider themselves college ready. The partnership is committed to nurturing the college and career aspirations of Washington's students. If a student dreams of earning a bachelor's degree, there is a place for them at one of the state's public baccalaureate institutions or two of the state's private universities.

In EPS, 560 seniors were identified this fall as guaranteed admission eligible (446 for Pacific Lutheran University) and received acceptance notifications. After receiving the letter, students then complete an admission application and additional requirements by the institution. The guaranteed admission program does not provide financial aid or cover the cost of college, so students will need to complete the FAFSA or WASFA and contact the financial aid office of the colleges for financial aid and scholarship information.

## The Gift of Attendance

Absences spike in the weeks before and after the winter holidays as families squeeze in a few more vacation days. Just a few missed days here and there, even excused absences, can add up and lost learning time can put your child behind in school.

This is as true in kindergarten as it is in high school. Put simply, too many absences at any age can affect a student's chances for academic success and eventually for graduation. This holiday season give your children the gift of an education and the habit of attendance.

Every day of school is an important opportunity for students to learn as well as to connect with their peers and teachers. As long as your child is healthy, please encourage showing up to class when school is in session.





If your child is absent, please email the school at their attendance email address, which you can find on the school website ([JHSattendance@everettsd.org](mailto:JHSattendance@everettsd.org) for JHS). If email is not possible, and **even if you leave a message** with the school attendance line, **please send a written note** to the school office within 30 days after your student returns to school.

## Board of Distinction

Everett Public Schools board of directors earned high honors with the designation as a *Board of Distinction 2023*. Applications are reviewed by a panel of judges that includes former and current educational service district superintendents, State Board of Education board members, former school directors, and other education leaders in Washington state. Scoring is based on how well applicants show alignment with the Washington School Board Standards, support their statements with data, and demonstrate a link between outcomes and decisions made by the board.



## Accepting Highly Capable Referrals until December 15

The Highly Capable (HC) Program in Everett Public Schools is designed to meet learning needs and challenge students who have advanced thinking and academic abilities. Highly Capable classes are open to students in 2nd, 3rd, 4th, and 5th grades. HC students learn and study in self-contained classrooms with a fast-paced curriculum that encourages and inspires them to develop higher-level thinking skills. HC classrooms are held in seven schools in the district, based on qualified enrollment. 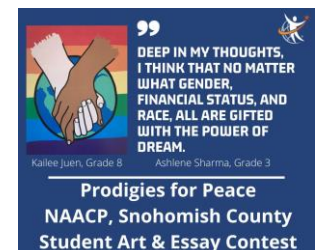

## Programa de Admisiones Garantizadas



Las Escuelas Públicas de Everett (EPS) están en su segundo año de asociación con el Programa de Admisiones Garantizadas de Washington (WAGAP), que garantiza la admisión a la Universidad Central Washington, la Universidad Eastern Washington, el Evergreen State College, la Universidad Saint Martin, la Universidad de Washington Tacoma, el estado de Washington. University y Western Washington University, y su primer año de asociación con Automatic Admissions Partnership, que garantiza la admisión a Pacific Lutheran University para ayudar a los estudiantes a alcanzar sus objetivos universitarios y profesionales.



Para ser elegible para admisiones garantizadas a las ocho instituciones participantes, los estudiantes deben tener o estar en camino de obtener al graduarse un GPA de 3.0 (3.3 para Pacific Lutheran University) y completar los cursos requeridos para la distribución académica universitaria.

El objetivo principal de esta colaboración es llegar a estudiantes que quizás nunca hayan contemplado seguir una educación universitaria o no se consideraban preparados para la universidad. La asociación está comprometida a fomentar las aspiraciones universitarias y profesionales de los estudiantes de Washington. Si un estudiante sueña con obtener una licenciatura, hay un lugar para él en una de las instituciones de bachillerato públicas del estado o en dos de las universidades privadas del estado.
