
New Principal Announced: Welcome to Cindy Foster

Our Salmon Have Been Released

Today our 5th grade students traveled to Lively Property in Mill Creek, just off Seattle Hill Road and released our Coho Salmon into Nickel Creek. Nickel Creek flows from Mill Creek to North Creek and eventually to the Sammamish River. From there our salmon will be able to travel to Lake Washington and eventually out to the Puget Sound.

We have been raising the salmon in our salmon tank at MCE since January and will be getting a new batch of salmon eggs this fall around November/December. These salmon are part of the conservation efforts of the Washington Department of Natural Resources to restore our native salmon populations to sustainable levels.



State Testing to Start Next Week

Next Thursday, our 5th Graders will take the WCAS, our state's science exam. It's the first of the state tests that will be administered to our 3rd, 4th and 5th graders over the next 3 weeks. We wish all our students well and encourage families to support students in being their best on testing days. As a reminder, the following are scheduled test dates: May 12, 17, 19, 24 & 26. **During our testing window, all 3rd-5th grade students will be asked to keep their chromebooks at school, so they can be charged each night and ready for testing each day.**
