The 57 Bus By: Dashka Slater

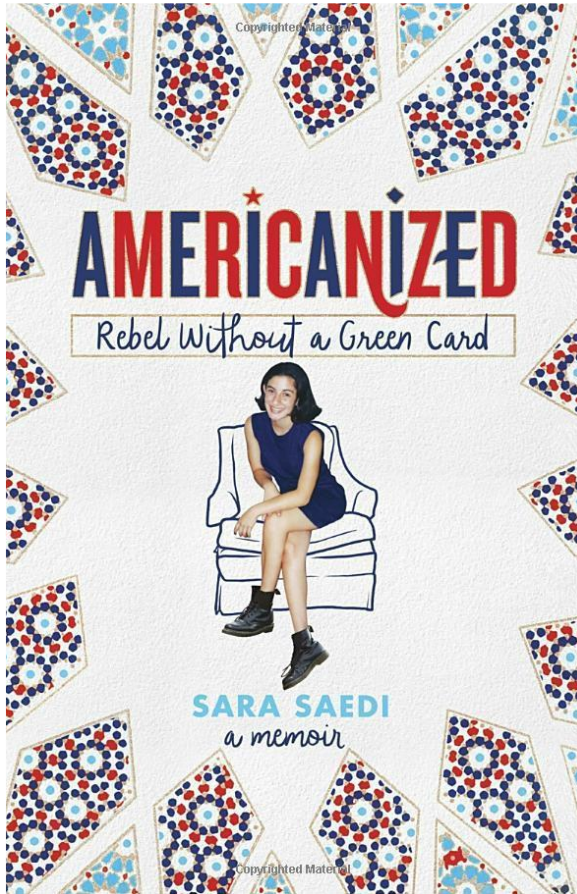

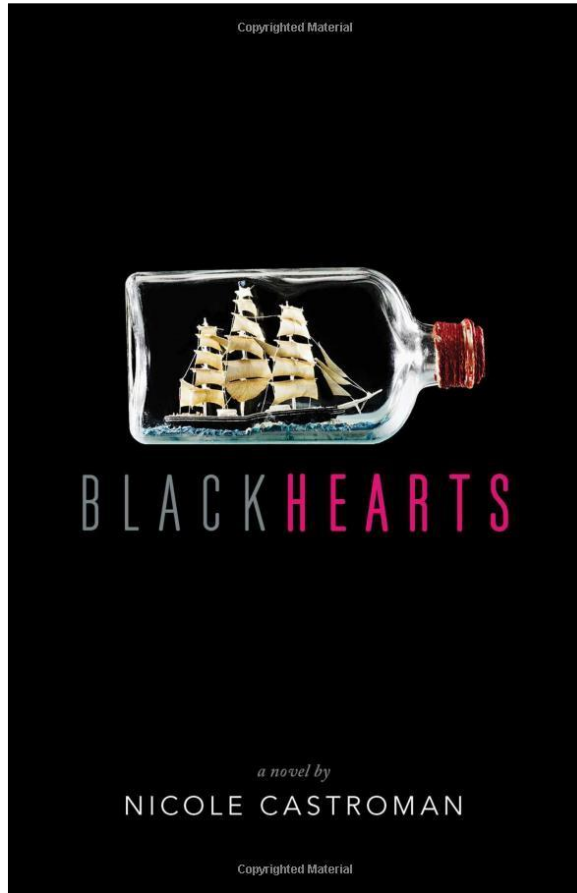

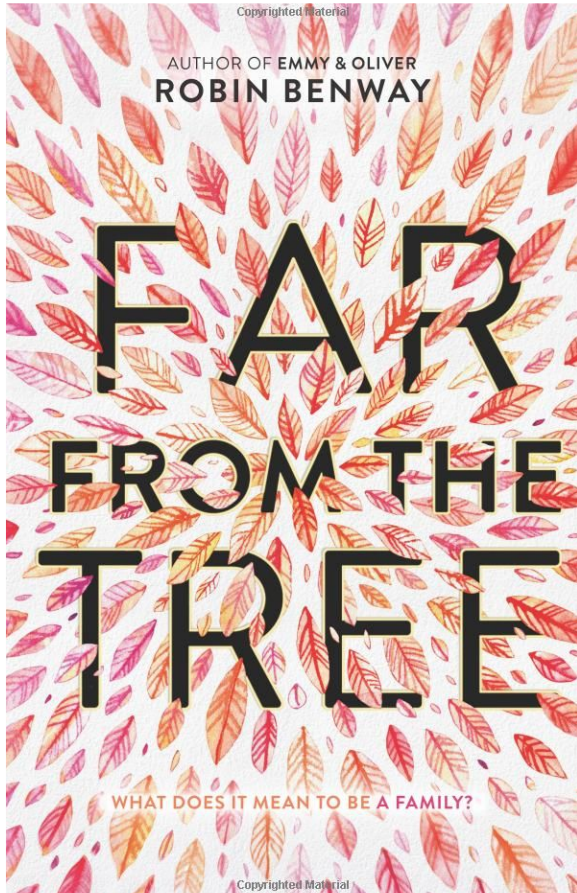


Exit, Pursued By A Bear By: E.K. Johnston

Far From The Tree By: Robin Benway

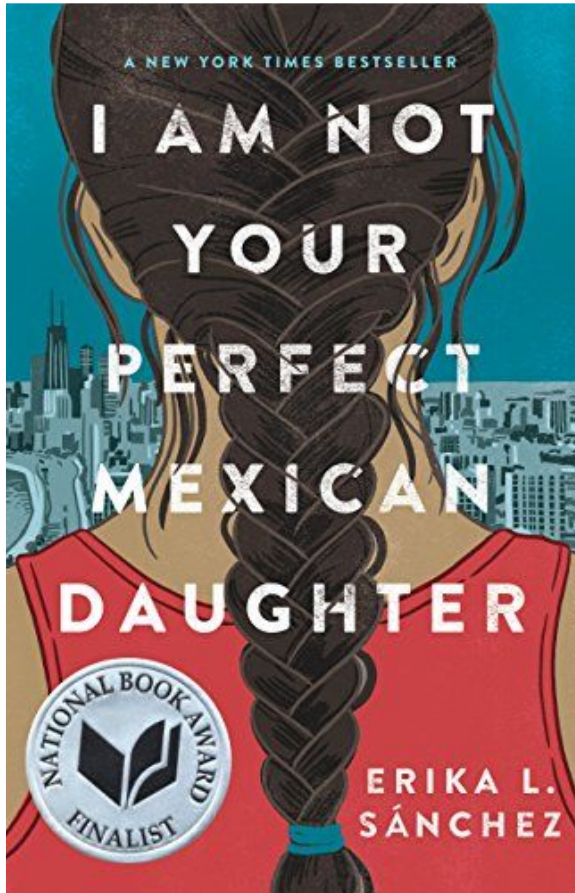

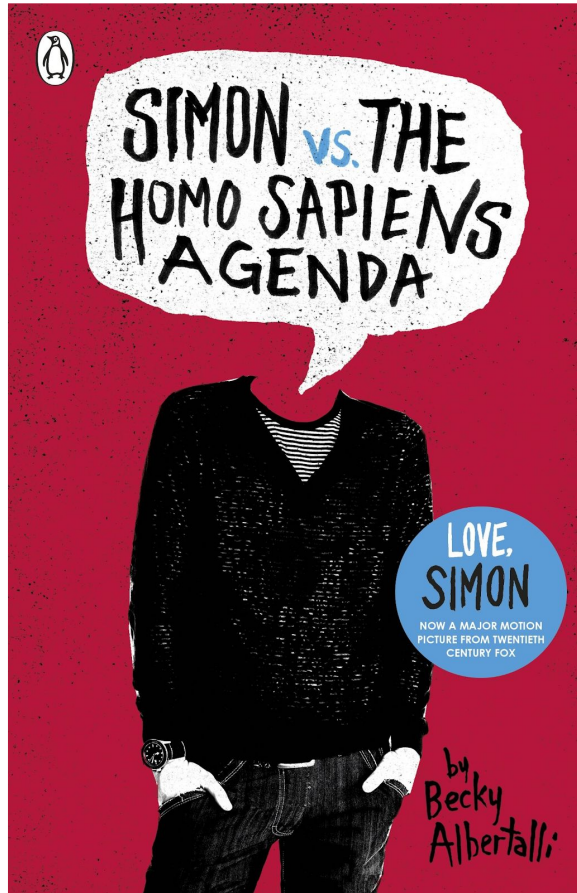




Renegades Marissa Meyer

Simon vs. The Homo Sapiens Agenda By: Becky Albertalli

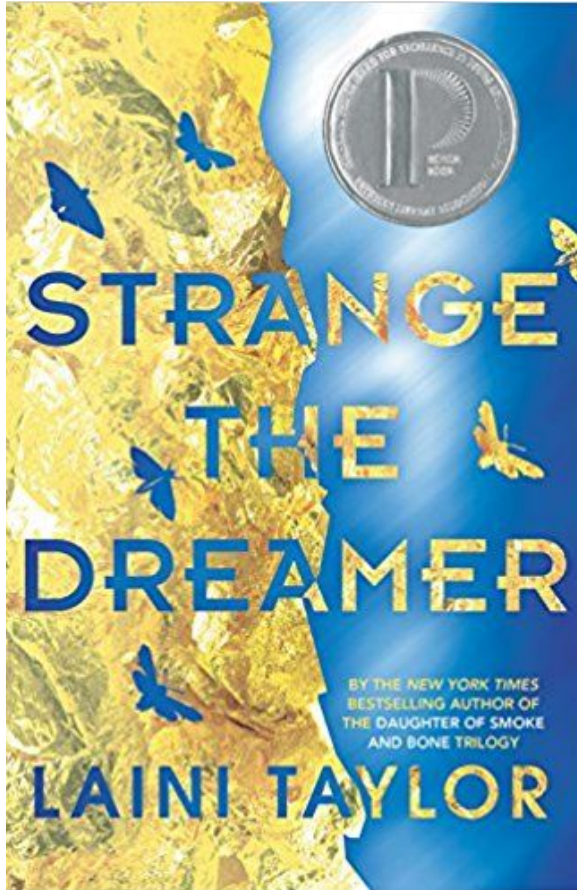
