

Hello, Timberwolf Families! It's hard to believe that spring semester is now underway. This is also the home stretch for our seniors, and we look forward to continuing to support their goals of graduation and beyond.

Last month, teachers from our AVID program (Advancement Via Individual Determination) shared with a number of their colleagues the importance that repetition plays in learning. Research as early as that by Hermann Ebbinghaus in the late 1800s supports the notion that memory is fragile and that our brains are actually designed to begin forgetting within minutes of initial exposure to information.



What he and modern research has shown is that the way to make long-term memory more reliable is to incorporate new information gradually and repeat it in timed intervals.



In his book *Brain Rules*, researcher and author John Medina explains that learning occurs best when new information is incorporated gradually into the memory rather than when it is jammed in all at once. If, for example, you have limited time to study in a week, it is far better to space out numerous repetitions over each day than to squeeze them all together. This leads to two (of his twelve) brain rules: "Repeat to remember" and "Remember to repeat." Nick of Time Foundation

Youth Heart Screening-Wednesday, March 14, at JHS

One high school-aged athlete suffers a sudden cardiac arrest every three days in the U.S! The leading cause of death in young athletes on the playing field is an undetected heart condition. The best way to detect these heart conditions is through a heart screening using an ECG (Electrocardiogram) and in some cases an Echocardiogram (ultrasound) of the heart.

The Nick of Time Foundation, in partnership with the University of Washington Medical Center, conducts ON-SITE heart screenings for adolescents and young adults ages 14-24. Screenings consist of a Heart Health Survey asking about possible signs and symptoms or family history of a heart condition. An ECG is performed that analyzes the electrical signals of the heart. In some cases, a limited physical exam or Echocardiogram of the heart is conducted. The results are reviewed on site by cardiologists and sports physicians experienced in heart screens.

A completed Health History form, including parent permission (if under 18), for EACH student must be turned in to the school to make an appointment. Click for the Health History form:

Career Readiness

Did you know our state will add 740,000 jobs in the next five years? But, according to a University of Washington research study, there is now a mismatch between the jobs opening and local residents seeking those positions. As a result, many local openings are filled by people from outside our region. Washington Roundtable members believe in the concept of "Washington jobs for Washington kids." For that concept to be a reality, Washington high school graduates must go on to earn a postsecondary credential. Today, fewer than 1 in 3 do so.

The 2018 Capital Bond funds will pay to transform portions of each of our existing three high schools into high tech vocational learning and training centers. In these centers, students will gain a head start on credentials that could enable them to live and work right here in our communities. The fourth high school (funding of which will be provided in the 2018 Capital Bond) will include a high tech vocational learning center in its design.
