The DRILL will be held next **Thurs.**, **10/19**, **at 10:19**. We will **NOT** have a special schedule since the drill only takes a minute; instead, we will not read announcements during 3rd period so that you will have some time to explain the drill and the expectations to your students.

Just before 10:19, there will be an announcement about the Great Washington ShakeOut. At 10:19 there will be a message to Drop, Cover, and Hold (on). All staff and students will get underneath a table or desk, find something to hold on to, and wait until the ALL CLEAR is given (approximately one minute). There shouldn't be any talking during the drill.
