Assemblage	A 3D artwork made by putting together found materials.
Book Arts	The art of making books, including bookbinding and making paper.
Graphic Design	Creating pictures, signs, or posters to share ideas.
Papier-mâché	A mix of paper and glue that hardens when it dries; used for making sculptures.
Printing Plate	A flat surface used to make a printed image.

ELEMENTS AND PRINCIPLES		
	Balance	Asymmetry: when two sides of an artwork aren't the same Symmetry: when two sides of an artwork look exactly the same
	Color	Cool: calm colors like blue, green, and purple Warm: bright and bold colors like red, orange, and yellow Intermediate/Tertiary: colors made by mixing a primary color with a secondary color
	Color Scheme	The combination of colors an artist uses in an artwork.
	Contour Line	The outline that shows the shape of something.
	Form	Cone: a 3D shape (or form) with a circular base that narrows to a point Cylinder: a form with two circles at each end, connected by straight sides Pyramid: a form with a base and sides that meet at a point at the top
	Implied Texture	How an artist makes something look like it has a surface feel (like bumpy or smooth).
	Overlap	When one shape covers part of another to show depth.



ELEMENTS AND PRINCIPLES		
	Perspective	A technique for showing depth on a flat surface to make things look 3D.
	Space	 The area around, between, and inside parts of a picture. Negative space: the empty space around an object. Positive space: the space taken up by objects in a picture.
	Value	Shade: the mixture of a color with black to make it darker. Tint: the mixture of a color with white to make it lighter.

SUBJECT MATTER		
	Figure	A drawing or image of a person from head to toe.
	Landscape	Background: the part of a picture that looks farthest from the viewer. Foreground: the part of a picture that looks closest to the viewer. Middle Ground: the area in a picture between the background and foreground.

DESCRIBING ART		
	Abstract	Art that doesn't look exactly like real things but shows shapes, colors, or ideas.
	Realistic	Art that looks like real life.

ARTISTIC PRACTICES		
C	Copyright	A law that protects an artist's work from being copied without permission.
É	Critique	To look at art closely and talk about its details.
	Curate	To choose, organize, and present artwork or objects.
	Interpret	Figuring out the meaning of an artwork.
ALL THE	Revise	To look at an artwork again and make changes to improve it.
