These are unusual times. Please know I will continue to work daily and if I can be of support to you in any way, contact me through email as I am not sure if I will be working from school or home. Some parents have asked me for suggestions for home. My suggestion would be, daily, 20 minutes I-Ready math, 20 minutes I-Ready reading, 20 minutes reading, 20 minutes writing and 20 minutes of mathematics, maybe join xtramath.org, (or get flash cards) and practice memorizing math facts, the program is free and will design fact practice to your child's current level of achievement. This program helped my daughter memorize math facts in second grade and later, multiplication facts. Please only ask your child to work 30 minutes at a time.

Please do not simply give your child a packet and ask him/her to work. I sent home many materials knowing your child would be home six weeks. Look through the materials and see what works for your child and family. Today, we enjoyed beginning a literature study of the book, <u>Tornado</u>. There is a journal to write in after reading each chapter answering a different prompt from the choices, 1-10. I would like my <u>Tornado</u> books returned if possible as I have a class set, but enjoy!

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
