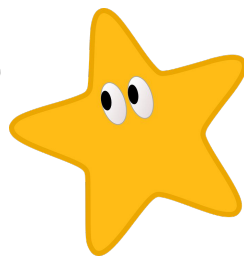

Summer Literacy & Mathematics

Several parents have asked me to create a summer learning schedule I believe will support their child with maintaining and improving skills over the summer. Here is a schedule: **(I will give summer journals to everyone.)**

Four Times Weekly:

- *Daily-10 min. Math i-Ready
- *Daily-10 min. Reading i-Ready
- *[Daily-Xtramath.org](https://www.xtramath.org) 10 min.
- *Read to self or someone 30 min. daily
- *2X weekly-write a paragraph about a subject of your choice and/or a letter, reread for complete sentences, capital letters and correct punctuation.
- *1X Weekly, download a Readworks (just like what I use in homework) lesson with comprehension questions, do online or on paper, remember to go back and find answers in the text, they are there! [Readworks.org](https://www.readworks.org) (free)
- [Pebblego.com](https://www.pebblego.com) is a district reading website and students can push a button to have stories read aloud.
- Tuesdays-visit school library to check out new books.

I would recommend 10 min. i-Ready math/daily & 10 min. i-Ready reading/daily 4X weekly. If your chromebook "glitches" over the summer, drive to our school parking lot, log on and let the chromebook update, this will usually take care of the problem.
- *JOIN The Everett Public Library, you can check out new books weekly and they have awesome student summer programs with PRIZES! They usually have a fun storytime hour too. I LOVE Marysville library and you could make a day of it and also visit Jennings Park which is right by The Marysville Library.
