All previous fines will be collected at orientation. You may pay online by going to the Gateway Website and clicking on "pay online" under "Quicklinks"

Debit/Credit Cards may be used at Orientation and purchases may be done at home using the "Pay Online" on our Website starting August 10th. If you are paying online at home, please bring your receipt with you to pick up your PE Uniform and Planner.

If you are planning to write checks, please note that you will need separate checks at orientation if you are planning to purchase items:

- A check to Gateway Middle School for: ASB cards, yearbooks, PE uniforms, School Planner, and any outstanding fines.
- A separate check to Gateway Middle School for deposits to students' cafeteria account
- A separate check to Gateway PTSA for membership and "Guardian Wear" available for purchase
- A separate check to Dorian (the photography studio) if you wish to purchase school photos

None of these are required on orientation day; however, this is a day we have items all centrally located. You can choose to pay for items later in the school year, as well.

Please return your Annual Health Form (yellow) to our Health Room Station during your designated Orientations time.

Familiarizing Students with Key Policies

As a Gateway staff, we feel it is important for students and parents to become familiar with several key student policies that are meant to help promote a more optimal learning environment.

Lockers & Backpacks: We assign and expect every student to use a locker. These lockers are assigned through the block classes. Students are also expected to keep their backpacks in lockers throughout the day mainly to:

- avoid classroom, lunchroom, and hallway congestion and improve safety;
- secure personal belongings and minimize theft risk;
- free students of having to carry heavy items throughout the day;

Every middle school in our district disallows backpacks in the classroom for similar reasons. We find that using lockers efficiently *actually decreases* the likelihood of students being tardy to class.

Cell phones & Electronics: Cell phones should only be used before and after school outside the building. As is the case in many secondary schools, text messaging and other communications (social media, texting, etc.) during the school day detracts from student learning and teacher instruction. **Cell phones must be kept in lockers.** In the event students need to contact parents, with permission from their teacher, they may use any of our classroom or office phones.

We highly recommend leaving other valuable electronic equipment at home to minimize distractions. If students choose to use i-Pods, MP3 players or tablets traveling to/from school, they must also be securely stored in lockers during school hours. At no time should video recording devices be used at school, inside or outside the building, without prior teacher/administrator approval. Students may elect to use e-readers at school for the purpose of reading e-books. Students who inappropriately use technology will be subject to disciplinary action following GMS procedures. Violation of the cell phone and electronics policies will result in confiscation. Cell phones and electronics will not be returned to the student. A parent or guardian must pick up the confiscated item, which will be securely kept in the office.

Gum: We prohibit gum on campus at all times, both outside and inside, primarily to:

- keep our campus clean;
- keep our classrooms more focused on learning ("professionalize" the learning environment).

Dress Code: Appropriate school attire also helps promote a productive learning environment. Upon purchase of a student planner, please review with your students the dress code policy in the student handbook.

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We will continue to communicate to our students that the spirit behind these and other rules is to free students of the distractions that often get in the way of learning. We are committed to partnering with you and appreciate parents' support in helping reinforce these policies.

Attention Parents of Incoming 6th Graders:

Washington State requires additional immunizations before entering 6th grade:

It is important that all students are current on their immunizations. To assure that you can provide immunization documentation when you register your child for 6th grade, please take the time this summer to make sure your child receives any immunizations that are due. Vaccine documentation must include the month, day and year it was received. History for chicken pox must include the approximate date or age your child had the disease. A signature of personal, religious or medical exemption is acceptable. To attend school, the immunization must be given before the first day of school in September.

The additional 6th grade requirements are:

- 1 dose of Tdap vaccine, which is for prevention of pertussis (whooping cough), diphtheria, and tetanus. *This is required* if it has been over 5 years since your child has received DTap, DT or Td and your child is 11 years old.
- 1 dose of varicella vaccine, which is for prevention of **chicken pox**.
