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
Item Pickup

First Day Log-in

Log-in information for Zoom calls and links to student lessons will be in staff Canvas pages. This way, all teachers will have a consistent spot to post coursework and links to resources. First period teachers will email parents/students the Zoom link for 1st Period on the first day to expedite student log-in. Teachers will ONLY be sending this information and will send any other introductory information, after the first day of school, unless it is necessary for your student. This is to streamline communication, as we know how much communication comes out to parents the first week of school.

Fall Entry Conferences

We are excited to announce our Fall Entry Conferences. We want to use the first week to ensure all of our students and parents have all of the tools they need to access school. Part of our plan is for each of our families to have a 10-minute window to connect with a teacher. Conferences will be with your student's 2nd hour teacher. Teachers will have some questions for you, and you will have a brief time to let us know if there are concerns about your student that we can assist with. More focused communication will take place after the first week after we have gotten to know your student.

Conferences will be Wednesday 9/9 from 12:30-3:00 pm and Thursday 9/10 from 12:30-5:30pm. If you would like to schedule a 10-minute appointment, please email your student's 2nd period teacher. Otherwise, teachers will be calling during those times. Please note that the call may come from a blocked number if staff are calling from a remote location and using their personal phones.



ChromeBooks

The new ChromeBooks that were distributed for student use is due to voter support of the 2016 Levy, which also supported teacher training that occurred last year, and wifi upgrades to our building this summer. We know that many families have other devices at home. All students should check out a ChromeBook for a couple of reasons. First, use of non-district devices to access digital resources may be limited by non-district technology. Second, when we are back live in school, students will need ChromeBooks and outside devices are not able to access district wi-fi.

Repairs to ChromeBooks are covered by the district unless the damage is thought to be malicious. If one of the district ChromeBooks is stolen, please file a police report, and provide the report # to us as we will work with police to recover devices.

ChromeBook Passwords

- 6th graders: student ID numbers and passwords do not change when transitioning schools. Your student ID and password from last year should still work.
- 7th and 8th graders: passwords do not automatically reset. You should be able to log in with last year's password.
- Students new to the district: Use your student ID as your login. Your password is your birthdate month/date: MMDD. If you were born in May 2008, your password would be 0508.

Accessing Canvas

Teachers will all be using Canvas as a common landing page and platform this year. Canvas will be accessible by both students and parents. The easiest way to access Canvas is by going to the district web page, selecting "Students," and then clicking on Canvas. Please note that enrollment of students in Canvas will happen closer to school opening, when student





Accessing Student Email

All students have an Everett School District email account. We encourage to use these for communication with teachers and staff, as this streamlines the process. Updates and announcements will also be sent to student email addresses via the Canvas system. On the student ChromeBook, click "apps.everettsd.org bookmarks" and then "Office 365." This opens the student's Microsoft Office menu. Click on "Outlook" and students will be able to use email to communicate with staff.

Live Assistance Line

Beginning the first day of school 9/9, and continuing until at least Friday, 9/18 we will be offering live assistance for parents and students. This will run from 8am-3pm each day. We know that sometimes it can be hard to navigate who to contact with your question. Our office staff will be available by Zoom during these times. If they can't answer a question, they will forward your question/concern on to the appropriate party to contact you. Please note that this is NOT tech support. We will send out the link prior to school starting.

Library

We are working to set-up online ordering and curbside checkout for library books. We will also use this process to pass out novels for ELA classes. We will communicate out when the system is ready.

School Supply List



Learning model status

Everett Public Schools will begin the 2020-21 school year with 100% remote learning using our staged approach to reopening. As the numbers of positive COVID-19 cases and deaths continue to rise across our state and in our region, it has become clear at this time that our more robust remote learning model will be the safest way to form the foundation for student learning this fall.




Staged reentry to schools will be determined by the impacts of a changing COVID-19 pandemic, available resources, direction from Snohomish Health District, OSPI and our Governor. Having the flexibility and agility to move to different models will enable Everett Public Schools to provide the best education possible in whatever scenario presents itself.

Attendance procedures

We look forward to teaching your child every day. Regular attendance is important, and we will work with you to ensure your child is engaged in learning to benefit from an excellent education. If your child will miss remote learning, please email the school at their attendance email address, which you can find on the school website.





Gradebook attendance to log student attendance daily. K-5 students will have attendance taken daily at the beginning of the day during their morning meeting. Grades 6-12 will have attendance taken in every class period.

2020-21 Immunization Changes

The way schools collect immunization records and comply with immunization rules has changed for the 2020-21 school year. As of August 1, 2020, a change in state immunization rules has affected three areas of immunization compliance:

- The definition of "conditional status" has been clarified. Students must turn in their immunization
 paperwork on or before the first day of in-person learning.
- All new immunization records from students need to be medically verified.
- The Tdap vaccine requirement for 6th through 12th graders has been changed to a 7th through 12th grade requirement.

A medically verified record includes one or more of the following and can be submitted by email to EPS.BuildingRN.MailList@everettsd.org:

- A Certificate of Immunization Status (CIS) printed from the Immunization Information System
- A physical copy of the CIS with a healthcare provider signature



- A physical copy of the CIS accompanying medical immunization records from a healthcare provider verified and signed by school staff
- A CIS printed from your MyIR account.

Access your family's immunization information

To access your family's immunization information from the Washington State registry visit, sign up for MyIR to view, download and print your student's immunization records securely online. Once you register, you can access the records anytime you need them. You can print your child's Certificate of Immunization Status for school, childcare and camp programs.

Mobile app

Social & emotional health

The outbreak of COVID-19 may be stressful for people and communities. Fear and anxiety about a disease can be overwhelming and cause strong emotions in adults and children.

Everyone reacts differently to stressful situations. The emotional impact of an emergency on a person can depend on the person's characteristics and experiences, the social and economic circumstances of the person and their community, and the availability of local resources. People can become more distressed if they see repeated images or hear repeated reports about the outbreak in the media.




Children react, in part, on what they see from the adults around them. When parents

ECEAP preschool is now enrolling for 2020-21



Everett Public Schools Early Childhood Education & Assistance Program (ECEAP) is a FREE preschool program for three-and four-year-old children from families with limited income. ECEAP prepares children for kindergarten and includes family support and health and nutrition services. It is funded in partnership with Snohomish County Human Services and Washington State Department of Children, Youth and Families.

ECEAP will be providing remote preschool

services this fall including virtual circle times and small groups, video libraries of fun, engaging activities, and learning materials for home-based activities. Additionally, ECEAP will support parents as their child's first and most important teacher through regular parent-teacher check-ins, family support coaching, resources, and online family support groups and informational classes.

The ECEAP preschool program is located at Cedar Wood (new for 2020-21), Garfield, Hawthorne, Lowell, Madison and Silver Lake elementary schools. ECEAP will be providing remote preschool services this fall including virtual circle times and small groups, video libraries of fun, engaging activities, and learning materials for home-based activities. Additionally, ECEAP will support parents as their child's first and most important teacher through regular parent-teacher check-ins, family support coaching, resources, and online family support groups and informational classes. Kids in Transition program

Kids in Transition (KIT) program supports students who qualify as homeless under the federal McKinney-Vento Homeless Act. Students without a fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence may qualify. The KIT program works to eliminate barriers to students' academic success and extra-curricular involvement. We ensure students experiencing homelessness have access to free school meals, school supplies, and uniforms. KIT can help students access extended day or summer school classes and provide access to tutoring when



needed. The KIT Program can also cover fees required to take part in activities such as school-sponsored sports, clubs, and required class fees. KIT transports eligible students to maintain school stability, as long as the commute is in the best interest of the student. Last year, Everett Public Schools served over 1,100 homeless students at some time during the school year. For more information, visit the KIT website or contact the KIT Program at 425-385-4032.



Backpacks for students in need

Students in need of a backpack, please reach out to your school to receive your supplies. Backpacks will be available for pick up at each school beginning August 31, the week before school.

Student opportunities and activities eflyers

We use *Peachjar* to email approved flyers from community organizations to parents and guardians. Schools also post those flyers on their websites. Look for the Peachjar button in the *Quicklinks* section of your school home page to see those flyers. You can also register there to have those flyers delivered to your email address if you aren't already receiving them.

Access to public records

District records are public records. Parents and other citizens have the right to ask to view or have copies of records defined as "public" under state and federal laws. These include parents' and legal guardians' student's records and records about discipline of school employees.

The district's general counsel office handles public records requests. Request records by writing to that office at PO Box 2098, Everett, WA 98213, sending an email request to <u>publicrecords@everettsd.org</u>, or calling 425-385-4150.



Your student's records are confidential

Everett Public Schools is serious about protecting student records and privacy. The district uses multiple security measures to safeguard student transcripts and other education-related records. Only those teachers, administrators and other staff members who work directly with students (and have an educational need to know) have access to individual student records. Staff members are required to maintain confidentiality of all information in a student's records.
