From the Principal

Gateway Family:

Though the remote work we all are engaging in is taxing, it feels as though we are starting to fall into the rhythm of the school year. Please know that our staff and I appreciate each of you.

The remote learning world has brought with it some unique questions with which we have grappled. One of those challenges is in regard to student use of cameras during Zoom sessions. I have been asked to set some specific guidelines for camera use – and that is a real challenge as each family, student, and class are unique.

We will not require students to have cameras on during Zoom classes. We know that families have different beliefs and customs, and different living situations and we respect that. Our adolescents face a wide variety of pressures and we want to ensure that we respect and support our student's needs. That said, many of our students are comfortable with camera use and that is great, as well.

Our primary goal is student participation and student learning. We know that the vast majority of our students are logging in each day. However, there are a few students who log onto the Zoom call, turn their screen off, and then do not participate in activities, or chat, and are non-responsive when class ends (though

their computer is still on the Zoom call). If this is happening, teachers will contact students and parents to troubleshoot any technology issues and ensure that communication on attendance is happening so that parents are aware.

I do want to share some of the scenarios in which we encourage students to find a safe space for themselves and turn on their cameras during Zoom:

When teachers are taking attendance. For the safety of our students, it is helpful that teachers can verify that the name on the Zoom screen and the student match.

- During teacher synchronous instructional time. It is helpful to teachers as they instruct to "see" students this allows teachers to read facial expressions to gauge understanding, see hands raised if students have questions, as well as solidify relationships that are vital to teaching and learning.
- In breakout rooms. Breakout rooms are a great tool which lets students work in small-group settings. This also provides students the chance to build relationships with other students.
- When performing/demonstrating. In music classes, science labs, PE, and other scenarios, the feedback from the instructor is largely based on being able to see the student's form, posture, enunciation, inflection, and movement.
- During class discussions/work time. We know that socialization is a big part of the middle school experience, and discussions are part of that. We want our students to get to know their peers as well as they can.

Parents, I encourage you to talk with your student to set expectations. We want to meet you and your student where you are at, not based on peer pressure or other outside factors.

I so appreciate all the feedback parents have provided to us to help make this a productive experience. Please don't hesitate to reach out.

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Did you miss a call from us?

If you missed a call from your school, please first check your voice mail, email or mobile app for the message rather than calling the school. Schools are often inundated with phone calls from parents after they send an automated call and cannot answer all of the calls.

Is your contact information up-to-date at school?

If your contact information has changed, please let your school know so we can reach you.

Homeless resources

We care about all our Everett Public Schools families and know many are experiencing economic impacts due to changes in the economy. If not your family directly, you may know others who are starting to question whether there is any help available. If you are staying temporarily with someone else because you lost your housing, or are staying in a motel, campground, shelter, outside or are in an inadequate place, you and your children have special rights at school. Everett Public Schools' Kids in Transition (KIT) program supports students who qualify as homeless under the federal McKinney-Vento Homeless Act. Students without a fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence may qualify. The KIT program works to eliminate barriers to students' academic success. If you believe your child qualifies, please complete the online Housing Questionnaire. For more information, visit the KIT website or contact the KIT office at 425-385-4032.

Rights include:

- Keeping your children in the same school even if you move, and receiving transportation to that school, as long as it is in the student's best interest;
- Enrolling in school immediately without the documents schools usually require;
- Receiving free school meals;
- Getting help with school supplies and other needs;
- Receiving extra support for youth who are on their own;
- Connecting young children with early childhood services;
- and referrals to other community resources.

Get resources and activities for your children from <u>Sesame Street in Communities</u>, including tips for <u>how to talk to your child</u> about homelessness and how to create a feeling of home even if you are moving around a lot.
