Minimum recommended courses for college:	In addition to graduation requirements shown above, <u>at least 2.0 credits of the same World Language</u> is required for entrance into most colleges and universities.
*Social Studies: If Washington State History is passed in Middle School, an additional .5 Social Studies elective is required to equal a total of 3.0 credits.	
New Requirement for Class of 2016 and beyond: Students <u>must</u> earn 1.0 credit in a mathematics-based quantitative course during the <u>senior year</u> of high school (i.e., Algebra 2 or higher, or specific Algebra-based Science courses). Appropriate career and technical courses can count – see your counselor.	
#PPR = Personalized Pathway Requirements – Classes that further the student’s own interests and align with each student’s High School and Beyond Plan.
