

new approach
to solving poverty

- A collaborative approach of United Way of Snohomish County that removes barriers to help families escape the traps of poverty.
- Currently, families face a network of services centered either around the child or the adult, that are difficult to navigate with many complex roads to resources.
- CORE combines two national models: The 2-Generational Approach, which addresses the needs of the child and the adult at the same time, and Collective Impact, which changes the way community partners work together.
- There are five CORE Collaboratives made up of more than 68 cross-sector partners, focused on long-term solutions for families with young children (birth to age 8, including prenatal).
