

We are off to a great start! It has been wonderful reconnecting with students, families and friends. I especially welcome our new students and families and hope you are starting to feel a part of the Woodside Community. This is my fifth year as principal at Woodside and I continue to be excited about the work we are doing to increase academic performance for all students. I look forward to meeting you when you are on campus or attending evening events at the school.

This year, teachers will begin teaching to the new Common Core State Standards (CCSS), which are a coherent progression of learning expectations in English language arts and mathematics designed to prepare K-12 students for college and career success. The CCSS communicate what is expected of students at each grade level, putting students, parents, teachers and school administrators on the same page, working toward shared goals. The November issue of the Toucan Flyer will feature information for parents about the new Common Core State Standards.

Beginning on Friday, October 4, all Everett Public Schools will dismiss 75 minutes early on FRIDAYS. Learning Improvement Fridays will be used for teachers to work together to review student work, analyze assessment data, plan lessons to reteach students who are not yet at standard, AND lessons to challenge those who are meeting or exceeding standard. This time will strengthen the instructional program and improve the individual performance of our students. We are very pleased to have this time and I assure you that it will benefit each and every student.

No Pets Allowed at Woodside!

Please keep all pets off Woodside's playground and school campus. If an animal or pet is on our campus, every effort will be made to contact the owner. If we cannot identify the owner, the pet will be impounded.

Policy 3418P states: 1. The principal shall approve the instructional purpose for each animal in the school. No animal shall come into schools without the principal's approval. 2. Prior to introducing any animals into the classroom, teachers shall ascertain that: students and school personnel are not allergic to the animal; the animals will present no physical danger to students; and students will be instructed in the proper care and handling of the animals. 3. Animals shall not be allowed to roam freely in the school. 4. Animals shall be housed in suitable, sanitary self-contained enclosures appropriate to the size of the animal or kept on a leash. 5. Teachers will be responsible for ensuring enclosures are kept in a sanitary condition. 6. Animals shall not be left in schools during holiday periods where practical (fish in tanks an exception), and teachers are not responsible for making arrangements for their care. 7. Dogs and cats brought to school must have a health certificate signed

by a licensed veterinarian.

Delayed start or closed schools

If we have to cancel school or delay the start of school, we will use our parent communication system to call in the morning after 5:45 a.m. with a brief message about the reason for closure or delay. We will also use local media and post the message on our website. If there is no announcement about Everett Schools, school is on the regular schedule.

As we are back together for another year at Woodside, it is good to remember that for a child to be successful in school, it takes a collaborative effort involving parents, students and staff. Parents and guardians play a key role in helping their child be ready to learn each day. Here are a few reminders:

Sleep

It is very important that your child get enough sleep. Younger elementary students need around ten hours of sleep or MORE per night. When they don't get enough sleep, it is difficult to concentrate; students cannot process information as quickly when they are tired.

Breakfast

Make sure your child eats something nutritious before going to school. Brains work better when there is fuel in their body. Even if a student had a snack before bedtime, without breakfast, his body will have had no food for energy for over twelve hours when he goes to lunch. Many families are on the go in the morning, which makes having a good breakfast even harder. If you stock your pantry and refrigerator with easy-to-go items like yogurt, cheese, granola and fruit, you should see a payoff in school performance.

Homework

It is essential that parents help to ensure that their children complete their homework. One way you can do this is by providing a consistent, organized and quiet spot where your child can do her/his homework. It is not your responsibility to do the homework, just to make sure it gets done. If homework is taking too long to get done, contact your child's teacher.

Low Stress

Children learn best when their lives are stress free. It is not possible to take all stress away, but it is important to keep adult problems away from children. If your child cannot do anything to fix or improve the situation, you probably want to consider not telling him or her about it.

Collaborating between home and school, the 2013-2014 school year can be another great one of many to come. Remember, everyone has the same goal: giving your child the greatest educational experience possible!

Music to our ears...

What's happening in music this October?

The students at Woodside have been doing wonderful things in music class since school started! Each day in music we focus on different concepts and various musical skills so we can become well rounded and informed musicians.

4th and 5th Grade students have been preparing for their African Drumming Concert, which will be Thursday, October 24th. We will be doing an afternoon performance for the school and an evening performance for parents at 7:00PM. The students have been learning folk songs, drum patterns, and xylophone melodies as we explore West African culture and history through music.

3rd Graders have been working on reading music notation from the staff (do-re-mi-sol-la) and practicing rhythm reading. The students will transfer their melodic and rhythmic skills to the xylophones later this month as they perform and create short songs!

In 1st and 2nd Grade, the students have been working on performing beat and rhythm on the hand drums and reading simple rhythms (quarter note and eighth notes). This month we will begin reading high and low patterns from the music staff and performing on the xylophones.

The Kindergarteners have been learning many new songs and singing games as we work on using a singing voice. Later this month, the kindergarteners will begin instrument exploration on the xylophones and hand drums.
