With Staff, Students, Parents and Committee Members in attendance they were able to come up with a more comprehensive recognition plan. Honor roll Students who meet a 3.5 GPA or higher will be given quarterly certificates of honor. At the Semester mark there will be another recognition. Congrats to EHS! * The Kodak – Volume 2 Edition 1 was published for a Nov. 28 th release with an article written by Jordan Rotert on The Caprice of Nesika. * Currently the Students are working hard to obtain money and food items for the Holiday Food drive. Kids have been standing outside of local grocery stores, collecting money, gift cards and food items to hand out to needy families this coming November 24 th . So far \$8000 in donations has been collected. Currently the School Board is working on figuring out the best possible way to each out to the public after two failed Levy's last year. They are working on a capitol Levy, which will address Technology in the classrooms and possibly the building of North Middle School and/or building a new Elementary school in the South end of the District.
