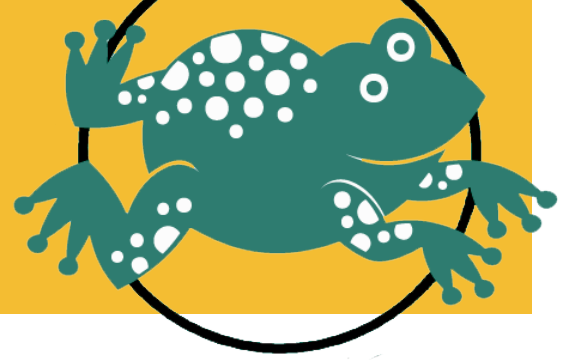

You will also know of some important curriculum changes this year. First, we are implementing a new Math Curriculum throughout grades K-5th, entitled Illustrative Math, by Kendall Hunt publishing company. Another new curriculum is Second Step. Second Step is a curriculum that specifically teaches social-emotional skills development. Lesson topics focus on development of a growth mindset, developing empathy, problem solving, and emotion management. Lastly, you will observe teachers placing a greater emphasis on Phonics instruction and Word Study within Reading instruction. This emphasis supports research in reading instruction that shows students benefit from explicit instruction in knowing how to pronounce and blend the specific sounds associated with many letter combinations as well as understanding the parts of words and how words are formed/developed.

We believe each of these curriculum updates will help us maintain research-based practices for your children. If you have questions specific to the instruction in your child's class, please reach out to their teacher. If I can support you further, please let me know.

Arrival and Dismissal Procedures

Arrival Times

8:50-9:10 a.m. Student Arrival
9:10 a.m. First Bell Rings

Dismissal Times

3:30 p.m. Regular Dismissal
2:15 p.m. LIF Dismissal
1:00 p.m. Early Release Dismissal

Student safety is our number one priority at Penny Creek. Many of our students arrive and depart from Penny Creek on assigned school buses. For those families that transport students to and from school by cars, we have designated specific arrival and departure procedures.

ARRIVAL: supervision will begin at 8:50 a.m.

Parent drop off/pick up lanes - drive up and drop off student, while remaining in the car.

- This is supervised until 9:10 a.m.
- Enter the parking lot through the west entrance.
- Turn right into the Parent drop off/pick up lane loop.
- Follow the Parent drop off/pick up lane around in front of the gym.
 - Pulling forward to the undercover playground area.
- Stay in the right lane, making sure to drive slowly.
- Driver remains in the car.
- When the car comes to a complete stop, the student unloads from the passenger curb side door.
- Students will walk through the undercover area and on to the campus.
- Driver departs from the Parent drop off/pick up by following the lane to the west exit on 132nd Street SE.

Walking Families – for parents who need to walk their students to school.

- Walk on to campus using the crosswalk.
- Parents walk students to the front iron gate drop off point by the office.

Arrival after 9:15 a.m. - park your vehicle and walk your student to the office to sign in. Students arriving after 9:15 a.m. will be tardy.

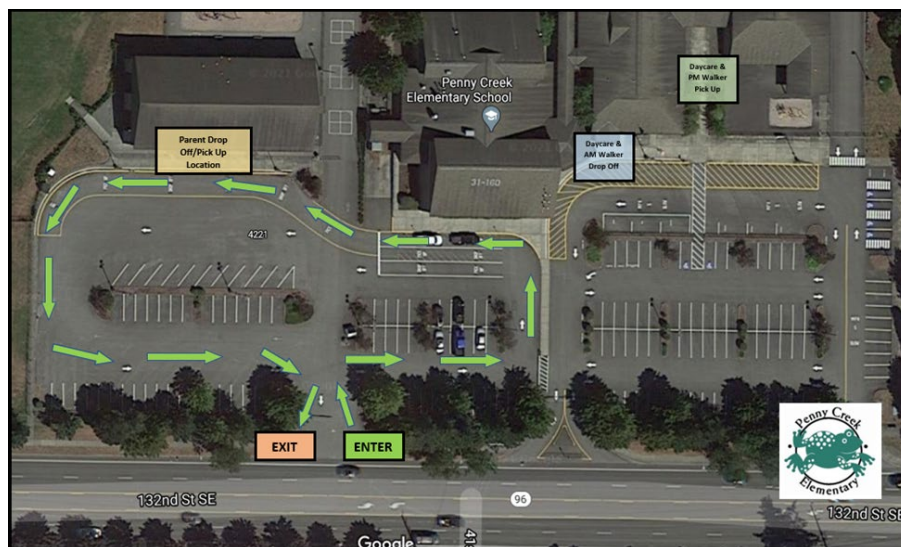
DISMISSAL: begins at 3:30 p.m.

Parent drop off/pick up lanes - drive up and pick up their student, while remaining in the car.

- This is supervised until 3:45 p.m.
- Enter the parking lot through the west entrance.
- Turn right into the Parent drop off/pick up lane loop. There are three ferry style lanes to wait in.
- Penny Creek staff member will release each ferry lane in an orderly manner.
- When the lane is released, follow the Parent drop off/pick up line to the front of the undercover playground area.
- Make sure to drive slowly and to pull as far forward as possible. Students will be waiting in the undercover area.
- Driver remains in the car.
- When the car comes to a complete stop, the student will load into the car from the passenger curb side door.
- Driver departs from the Parent drop off/pick up by following the lane to the west exit on 132nd Street SE.

Walking Families - for parents who need to walk to school to pick up their students at departure time.

- Walk on to campus using the crosswalk.
- Parents wait for students to be released from the doors located between Office and Kindergarten Playground.



Penny Creek Attendance Corner

If your student is absent or tardy from school, please email the attendance office at pceattendance@everettsd.org to let us know the reason for the absence or tardy. There is also a direct link on our webpage at: <https://www.everettsd.org/pennycreek>

- Absences must be reported (by email or note) within 30 days after a student returns back to school, not including Holidays or weekends, in order to have the absence excused. Emails or notes turned in past the 30-day timeframe will be accepted; however, the absence is not excused and will be coded as such.
- Automated attendance calls will be sent out daily at 10 a.m. If your student will be absent or tardy you must notify the office before 9:15 a.m. If it is reported after this time you may receive the automated call.
- Please view the [Everett School District Attendance Procedure 3122P](#) for more information (including definitions of absences).
- Did you have a medical appointment for your child, or they were sick, and you brought them to the doctor? If so, make sure to ask for a medical note from the provider. Email the note to the attendance office so those absences can be coded as a medical note excused absence.

Checking out a Penny Creek student during the school day

Sometimes it is necessary for a parent/guardian to pick up a student before Penny Creek's dismissal time. To help us prepare, please send a note or email the school office at PennyCreek@everettsd.org in advance, letting us know the specific date, time and who will be picking up your child. Students who are dismissed during the school day must be signed out from the school office by their parent/guardian (or adult designee) before leaving the school grounds. If an adult designee is coming to check out your child, a note or email to the school office at PennyCreek@everettsd.org must be submitted by the guardian to confirm. Students will be called from the classroom for dismissal once the parent/guardian (or adult designee) arrives at the office. For the safety and security of students, we will ask for photo identification.

Changes to a student's daily going home plan

Occasionally, you may need to change the plan of how your child is going home at the end of the school day. If this is the case for your family, **we ask that a guardian sends an email to the school office at PennyCreek@everettsd.org and the classroom teacher by 2:45 pm.** Please include the name of your student, their teacher, and the change of plan. Our office will then deliver this information to your student. This method of communication helps to support our staff with accurate dismissal information.



Strategic Plan refresh

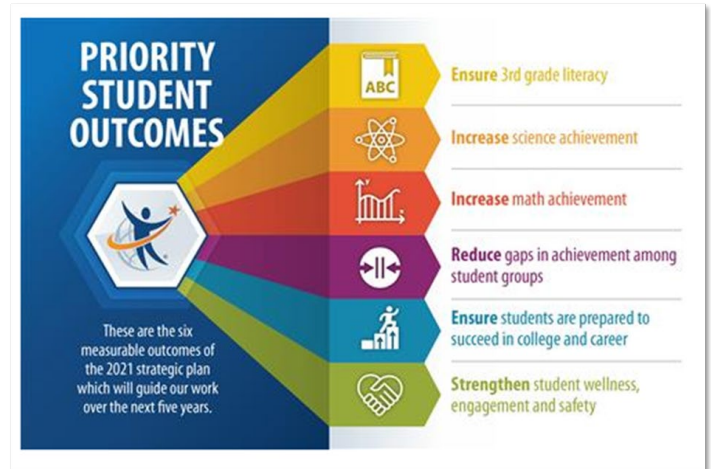

Meals free 2021-22 school year



Along with returning to 100% in-person this fall, we are also able to continue serving FREE meals to all children until June 30, 2022! Free meals are available this school year for all on-site students! The meal program is federally funded, and meal costs are reimbursed by the USDA. To find out the menu for breakfast and lunch at your student's school, please visit the food and nutrition website on everettsd.org.

Families who qualify for Free and Reduced Meals should still complete an annual application form. Approved free and reduced applications help fund other programs and can also help waive other fees for your family. Applications are available online or at your student's school.

Attendance procedures

We look forward to seeing your child at school every day. Regular school attendance is important, and we will work with you to ensure your child is present to benefit from an excellent education. If your child is absent, please email the school at the attendance email address,

If email is not possible, and even if you leave a message with the school attendance line, please send a written note to the school office within 30 days after your student returns to school.

2021-22 Immunization Records

As a reminder as of August 1, 2020, a change in state immunization rules has affected two areas of immunization compliance:

- The definition of "conditional status" has been clarified. **Students must turn in their immunization paperwork on or before the first day of in-person learning.**
- All new immunization records from students need to be **medically verified**.

A medically verified record includes one or more of the following and can be submitted by email to

EPS.BuildingRN.MailList@everettsd.org:

- A Certificate of Immunization Status (CIS) printed from the Immunization Information System
- A physical copy of the CIS with a healthcare provider signature
- A physical copy of the CIS accompanying medical immunization records from a healthcare provider verified and signed by school staff
- A CIS printed from your MyIR account.



Access your family's immunization information

To access your family's immunization information from the Washington State registry visit, sign up for [MyIR](#) to view, download and print your student's immunization records securely online. Once you register, you can access the records anytime you need them. You can print your child's Certificate of Immunization Status for school, childcare and camp programs.

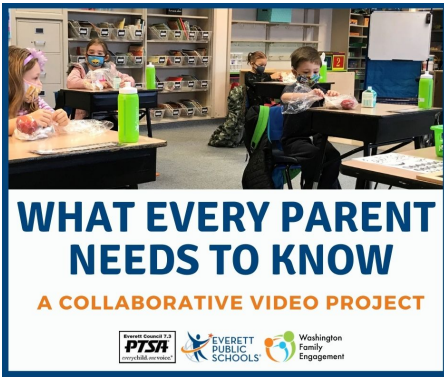

What Every Parent Needs to Know video series



The Everett PTSA Council collaborated with Everett Public Schools staff and Washington Family Engagement to develop video resources for families which provide fundamental information to navigate school systems, advocate for their student(s), and actively participate in public education.

The project of five videos, entitled "What Every Parent Needs to Know," provides an overview of topics that parents felt were essential for building a foundation for authentic parent and family engagement. Video topics include: Student Education Rights, Get Engaged in Your Children's Education, What to Do About Bullying, Advocating for Your Student and Understanding Public Schools.

The initial material was created by Washington Family Engagement and further reviewed by parent and community groups, as well as Everett School District staff, to ensure accuracy, relevancy, and access. The videos were recorded by various district staff and are available on the district's Parent University webpage, with translations recorded and available in Spanish, and subtitles in Russian, Vietnamese, and Arabic.

Care Solace resource

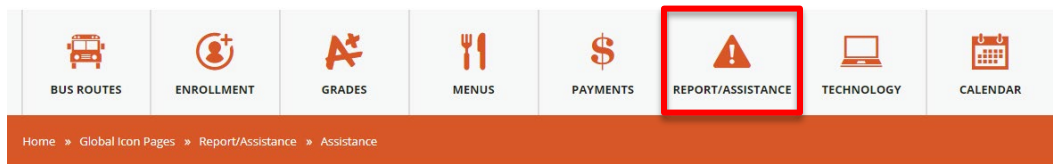


Everett Public Schools fosters a culture that promotes the health, safety and well-being of students, parents and staff. To continuously support this commitment, the district has partnered with **Care Solace**.

Care Solace is an [online resource](#) with a live 24/7 concierge meant to assist individuals in finding local mental health-related programs and counseling services. Care Solace is a tool for school staff and families to connect with community-based mental healthcare resources and providers. Their proprietary care navigation system taps into a vast database of mental healthcare resources to find carefully vetted local therapists and programs in minutes. Care Solace is available for use by district families and staff at no cost.

ECEAP preschool accepting applications for 2021-22

Everett Public Schools Early Childhood Education & Assistance Program (ECEAP) is a FREE preschool program for three- and four-year-old children from families with limited income. ECEAP prepares children for kindergarten and provides family support and health and nutrition services. It is funded by the Washington State Department of Early Learning.

The six ECEAP sites within our school district are Cedar Wood, Garfield, Hawthorne, Lowell, Madison, and Silver Lake elementary schools. Space is limited – apply early! For an application or more information, please visit the [district ECEAP website](#) or call 425-385-4628.



Kids in Transition program

Kids in Transition (KIT) program supports students who qualify as homeless under the federal [McKinney-Vento Homeless Act](#). Students without a fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence may qualify. The KIT program works to eliminate barriers to students' academic success and extra-curricular involvement. We ensure students experiencing homelessness have access to free school meals, school supplies, and uniforms. KIT can help students access extended day or summer school classes and provide access to tutoring when needed. The KIT Program can also cover fees required to take part in activities such as school-sponsored sports, clubs, and required class fees. KIT transports eligible students to maintain school stability, as long as the commute is in the best interest of the student. Last year, Everett Public Schools served over 1,100 homeless students at some time during the school year. Backpacks for students in need

Access to public records

District records are public records. Parents and other citizens have the right to ask to view or have copies of records defined as "public" under state and federal laws. These include parents' and legal guardians' student's records and records about discipline of school employees.

The district's general counsel office handles public records requests. Request records by writing to that office at PO Box 2098, Everett, WA 98213, sending an email request to publicrecords@everettsd.org, or calling 425-385-4150.

Your student's records are confidential

Everett Public Schools is serious about protecting student records and privacy. The district uses multiple security measures to safeguard student transcripts and other education-related records. Only those teachers, administrators and other staff members who work directly with students (and have an educational need to know) have access to individual student records. Staff members are required to maintain confidentiality of all information in a student's records.

Procedimientos de asistencia

Registros de inmunización 2021-22

Como recordatorio, desde el 1 de agosto de 2020, un cambio en los reglamentos estatales de inmunizaciones ha afectado dos áreas de cumplimiento:

- Se ha aclarado la definición de “estado condicional”. **Los estudiantes deben entregar sus documentos de inmunización antes del primer de asistir a su aprendizaje en persona.**
- Todos los nuevos registros de inmunizaciones de los estudiantes necesitan ser **verificados medicamente.**

Un registro verificado medicamente incluye una o más de las siguientes opciones y pueden ser enviadas por email a EPS.BuildingRN.MailList@everettsd.org:

- Un certificado impreso del estado de inmunización (CIS) del sistema de información de inmunizaciones.
- Una copia física del certificado CIS con la firma de un proveedor de atención médica.
- Una copia física del certificado CIS acompañado de los registros de inmunizaciones por parte de un proveedor de atención médica verificado y firmado por el personal escolar.
- Un certificado CIS impreso de su cuenta en MyIR.

Acceso a la información de inmunización de su familia

Para acceder a la información de inmunizaciones de su familia en los registros del estado de Washington, regístrese a [MyIR](#) para poder consultar, descargar e imprimir los registros de inmunizaciones o vacunas de manera segura y en línea. Una vez que esté registrada, podrá acceder a estos registros cuando los necesite. Puede imprimir el certificado del estado de inmunización para la escuela, la guardería y los campamentos.

Video serie “Lo que cada padre de familia debe saber”

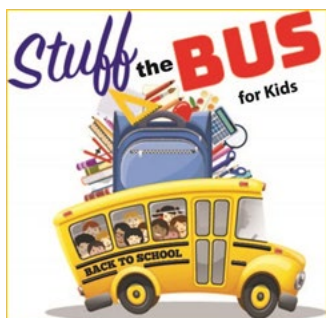


Programa de “Kids in Transition” (niños en transición)

Los niños en transición (KIT) brinda soporte a los estudiantes que califican como niños o jóvenes bajo la ley federal [McKinney-Vento Homeless Act](#). Los estudiantes que no cuenten con una residencia fija, regular o adecuada para pasar la noche pueden calificar. El programa KIT trabaja para eliminar las barreras para lograr el éxito estudiantil y la participación extracurricular. Nos aseguramos que los estudiantes que están sin hogar tengan acceso a comidas gratuitas, útiles escolares y uniformes. KIT puede ayudar a los estudiantes a acceder las clases de día extendido o la escuela de verano y darles acceso a tutorías cuando sea necesario. El programa KIT puede también cubrir las cuotas requeridas para ser parte de actividades como deportes patrocinados por la escuela, clubs y cuotas de clases requeridas. KIT transporta a estudiantes calificados para mantener su estabilidad escolar siempre y cuando el traslado sea de beneficio para el estudiante. El año pasado, las Escuelas Públicas de Everett sirvieron a más de 1,100 estudiantes sin hogar en algún punto durante el año escolar.
