Curriculum Corner

What's the math focus in grades K-5?

- **K** Comparing and ordering numbers 0-10
- 1 Understanding subtraction
- 2 Understanding addition and subtraction
- **3** Understanding meanings of multiplication using facts and patterns
- **4** Generate and analyze patterns as well as write rules for the patterns
- **5** Understanding volume, adding and subtracting decimals

Math activities you can do at home:

- Play a number memory game by writing down the numbers on one side of a card and match up pairs
- Play multiplication challenge with cards by choosing two cards and multiplying the numbers, then take turns
- Give your child a number appropriate to them. Explain that number is the answer. Ask your child to figure out as many different ways to make that number.

What's the big question for REACH Reading in grades K-5?

- K- "What do families do together?"
- 1- "When is something alive?
- **2-** "What does it take to survive?"
- **3-** "What happens when nature loses its balance?"
- **4-** "Just how smart are animals?"
- 5- "What is the power of the sun?"

Reading activities to do at home:

- Read a story using different character voices
- Read with your child every day
- Ask your child what they're learning about the big question of the REACH unit this month
