From the Principal

Dear Madison Families,

Happy New Year to all! I hope you had a restful break with your family and friends. Madison staff was very happy to welcome the students back this week. Their smiles lit up the classrooms and hallways.

As always, please be sure your students are reading books each night. If they are unable to read yet, it is important that you read to them each night. Please consider attending a Madison Family Open Library Night for books you can read as a family. The first one of the new year is January 18th from 4-6pm, and a good time is always had by all!

The end of the first semester is January 26th, and there will be no school for students January 29th. Report cards will be mailed home the first week of February.

As you know, we have been working hard at instilling a growth mindset in all of our students at Madison. Growth mindset is the belief that with practice, perseverance and effort, people have limitless potential to learn and grow. When we use growth mindset in our daily lives, we tackle challenges happily, unconcerned about making mistakes or being embarrassed for not knowing something. We focus on GROWTH instead, and growth is what we get. You may have heard your student say I don't know how to do that YET. At Madison we focus on the Power of Yet. Other growth mindset phrases you might hear from your student are things like: "I think I can work hard at this"; "I enjoy challenges"; "Maybe I can try to solve this problem a different way". These phrases indicate that your child believes in the power of his/her brain to grow with hard work. On the other hand, if you hear your child saying things like "I am not good at math" or "I can't do this", this indicates that they are operating on a fixed mindset. People that operate with a fixed mindset often avoid challenges because they fear failure. This limits their growth and potential.

Please encourage your students to operate with a growth mindset. There are tons of resources on the internet for teaching kids about growth mindset, and Madison staff is always happy to discuss this theory with parents if you have questions. Each month we have a growth mindset mantra that we repeat each morning on the announcements together as a school. Our January mantra is "My Brian is like a muscle that grows!" 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January is School Board Appreciation Month





Smarter Balanced Assessments

2018 Capital Bond and Replacement Levy

The school board voted to propose a Capital Bond to meet future readiness needs and a Replacement Levy to replace the expiring one. If voters approve both the Capital Bond and Replacement Educational Programs and Operations Levy on Feb. 13, 2018, tax collections to complete those projects begin in 2019. That year the local school tax rate is projected to be \$4.89 per each \$1,000 of property value. That rate is the lowest local school tax rate for property owners in the district since 2013. Support for students in temporary or inadequate housing

If your family is in a temporary or inadequate living situation due to a loss of housing or a family crisis, your child may be eligible for certain educational rights and services. If you lost your housing and now live in a shelter, motel, vehicle, camping ground, temporary trailer, on the street, doubled up with family or friends, or in another type of temporary or inadequate housing, your child might be able to receive help through a federal law called the McKinney-Vento Act. The McKinney-Vento Act may be able to provide support through transportation so that your child can continue enrolled in school, or through access to programs and services so that your child can participate fully in school.
