Computer Adaptive Test (CAT): Adaptive tests taken on a computer adjust to a student's ability by basing the difficulty of future questions on previous answers.

Performance Task (PT): A Performance Task challenges students to apply their knowledge and skills in response to a real-world problem. The task is a collection of questions and activities that connect to a single theme. This task is designed to measure a student's depth of understanding, ability to answer difficult questions, and the ability to apply their learning.

Dear Parent/Guardian,

Throughout the remainder of the school year Mrs. Mahorney the counselor will be going into every classroom, K-5th grade and teaching (1), 30 minute lesson about Stranger Danger. This lesson will teach children skills to help keep themselves safe from the possibility of a dangerous situation with a stranger.

Key components:

- · Why is stranger danger important?
- · General safety rules
- · Scenario Discussions
- · Short video clip
- \cdot Take home worksheet

Your support and involvement around this important topic is greatly appreciated. We encourage you to have discussions with your child around stranger danger and safety skills. Practicing safety skills at home help students be prepared to use them in the community if need be.

ECEAP PRESCHOOL ACCEPTING APPLICATIONS FOR 2022-23

Everett Public Schools Early Childhood Education & Assistance Program (ECEAP) is a FREE preschool program for three- and four-year-old children from families with limited income. ECEAP



prepares children for kindergarten and provides family support and health and nutrition services. It is funded by the Washington State Department of Children, Youth and Families (DCYF).

The six ECEAP sites within our school district are Cedar Wood, Hawthorne, Jackson, Lowell, Madison, and Silver Lake elementary schools. Students across the district are welcome to attend. SUMMER ACADEMY REGISTRATION IS OPEN

Registration is open for Summer Academy 2022 and <u>registration materials are online</u>. The elementary and middle school summer academies are available for current students in

kindergarten through seventh grade to reinforce learning in reading, writing, and mathematics. Priority enrollment will be given to students who meet eligibility requirements. A variety of summer academy courses are available for high school students including district-facilitated credit recovery courses, Online High School and career exploration, mentorship, and internship opportunities through Everett Career Link. Tuition is waived for EPS students for elementary, middle and high school (including OnlineHS.net courses) students.

Dual-language Spanish Immersion Program

The dual-language Spanish immersion program at Emerson Elementary School is an option for fall 2022. Families with children entering kindergarten will have the option to choose the dual language strand. This program gives elementary students an opportunity to complete the Everett Public Schools curriculum in a nontraditional and exciting way by immersing them in Spanish language and culture from kindergarten through twelfth grade. Students in the program will become proficient in both Spanish and English while learning the same curriculum content as their peers outside the program.

Priority will be given to students within the Emerson Elementary School attendance area. If a high number of students apply, a lottery will be conducted to select students. If the class is not filled from those in the Emerson attendance area, an additional lottery from beyond the school attendance area will be conducted.
