Thank you: Speaking of PTA and Lighthouse, I'd like to thank both groups for their financial contributions that support our school and our students this year. PTA funds our IXL site license, and Lighthouse pays for our MobyMax site license. In addition to all sorts of other line items in their budgets that support student learning and family involvement, both organizations also run grant programs that staff can apply for. PTA grants awarded this year were:

- Ms. Peterson: \$63 for Art Goes to School in-class experience
- Mrs. Trautmann: \$153 for new soccer balls for PE
- Mr. Haney: \$250 for beginning reading books for the library
- Ms. McGuire & Ms. Pettis: \$300 for balls and equipment for the playground
- 2nd grade: \$300 for field trip to Pacific Science Center
- 4th grade: \$300 for Paws career visit field trip and art supplies
- Mr. French & Mr. Nelson: \$300 for field trip to see a play

Lighthouse awarded a \$1,000 grant to Mrs. Klujber to purchase two Dash and Dot robots, two iPad minis, and several Arduino circuit boards to support STEM education.

State testing: As explained in detail in <u>last month's newsletter</u>, students in third, fourth, and fifth grades will take the state-mandated Smarter Balanced Assessment in April and May. Fifth-graders will also take the Measurement of Student Progress in science. The testing schedule is below; please mark your family calendars accordingly, and avoid scheduling medical appointments or other absences on testing days. Please ensure that your child comes to school on time each day, having had a good night's sleep and a full breakfast.

Attendance Courtesy Reminders

Courtesy notes are sent home when a student is absent and the school did not have contact from parent /

guardian excusing the absence. At Jefferson these notes are sent each week for the previous week's

attendance. If you receive one of these letters, please provide an excusable reason, sign and return to the

office. If we receive the courtesy note back signed but without a reason, the absence is then unexcused. The

Office of the Superintendent of Public Instruction (OSPI) requires schools to have absences excused with an excusable reason.

The codes listed below are the only codes the state/district will recognize as an excusable reason for absence:

- A Participation in a district or school approved activity
- B Illness/health/medical appointment
- C Family emergency
- D Religious purposes
- E Judicial proceeding/Jury duty
- F Post-secondary program/visit
- G State recognized search and rescue activities
- H Directly related to student's homeless status
