On another topic, some of you may have received letters about your child's unexcused absences. In the past, any absence you notified us of was excused. But last year, district policy shifted to align with new state law. Absences are now excused if they fall into eight categories, and family vacations are not excused. This information was sent home last year, at the beginning of this school year, and is on our website. Along with the policy change, the district requires that letters be sent home after a certain number of absences. These are auto-generated by our attendance system. Please understand that these are just notifications; you are not expected to do anything with them. If we have major concerns about your child's attendance, we will make personal contact, not rely on letters. Thank you for ensuring that your child is here, on time, each day – it's foundational to learning!

I am very excited for this year's UPCOMING CONCERT slated for <u>Thursday</u>, February 9, at 6:30 <u>P.M. in the Everett Civic Auditorium located at 2416 Colby Ave</u>. Please save the date on your calendar. The first through fifth grade classes will be presenting a concert with the theme "Togetherness." The doors will open at 6:30 P.M. If you are a parent who works at night, think about another family in the school you might trust to transport your child to and from the concert. The students have been working so hard, I would hate for any child to be left out of this uplifting time making music together.

Each grade level (1<sup>st</sup>-5<sup>th</sup>) will perform several songs. The concert should be a little more than an hour in length. Children will be required to sit up front with their teachers, perform, and then return to their teachers until the concert is completed. I am asking that you stay for the entire program as a way to show support for all involved. Kids are to participate in the following ways: Every child is expected to sing in the mass choir formed with each grade level of over 100 kids on that evening, learn the songs, and do their very best job.

Besides singing and playing as a group, there are some other opportunities for students to display their gifts. There will be spots between the choirs for students (<u>mainly upper grades</u>) to perform on an instrument, sing, dance and/or act. # PTA from a Principal's Point of View

As the Jefferson principal, PTA matters to me, and to our school. The PTA does so much to support all of our students and staff! Please take a few short minutes to learn more about PTA.

What is PTA? Simply put, it's a group that supports our school. Currently, there are about 180 PTA members. Not a member but want to join? Pick up a membership form in the school office.

**Does joining PTA involve a time commitment?** It doesn't have to! Your membership fee alone supports students and staff. Volunteering to help (a little or a lot) is appreciated, but not required!

Who runs PTA? PTA is an all-volunteer organization with a five-member board, four of whom also work. Their job is to oversee the running of PTA, and to recruit other volunteers to organize events.

Why are there so many events on the calendar? Because there are just three to four nights a month designated for elementary school events, the calendar fills up with PTA, Lighthouse, and camp fund-raising events. Jefferson's annual/traditional events were calendared back in July in order to hold the dates, before volunteer event chairs were recruited.

Why have so many events been cancelled this year? Again, PTA has an all-volunteer board whose members oversee the organization. They rely on others to coordinate events, with their support. PTA events such as Skate Deck and Movie Night cannot happen if no one volunteers to organize and run them. Camp fund-raising events such as McTeacher Night and the Pancake Breakfast depend on fourth-grade parent volunteers.

Why is PTA so important? PTA does so much, big and little, to benefit all students and staff members:

- New playground equipment
- Classroom grants to be used as teachers wish to benefit students
- Grants that support our specialists: library books, technology, PE equipment, etc.
- Low-cost family/community events
- Providing families an opportunity to be involved in the school community and to have a voice in their children's educational experience
- Building relationships among families
- Book fairs, the Holiday Store, weekly student store and popcorn sales
- Community service opportunities such as the food bank, Holiday Baskets, and coin drive
- Supporting teachers with dinner on conference nights, a Keurig coffee maker, etc.
