From the Principal

Happy 2017! I hope that everyone had very happy new year and holiday celebrations, and that you stayed warm through the recent deep freeze. It was great to see students' smiling faces back at school last week! We began our first few days of 2017 with a review of schoolwide behavior expectations (hallways, bathrooms, cafeteria, recess, guest teacher, and field trips). Ask your child to tell you about what he or she does to meet these expectations. Students and teachers then quickly settled back into their routines of learning and growing!

Every year, each school staff writes a School Improvement Plan (SIP) that guides their work for the year. Mr. Natividad and I will be sharing Jefferson's during upcoming PTA and Lighthouse meetings. We've included a "SIP at a Glance" page later in this newsletter for you to read, and the full plan is available on the school website if you'd like to go deeper. A big part of the SIP has to do with creating a welcoming environment and partnering with families, so please let me know what we else we can do as a staff to make Jefferson a great place for families!

Important information and reminders

- Welcome counselor Daniel Wolf: Mr. Wolf will be covering Ms. Ortiz-Self's leave of absence through the end of April. He has been at Jefferson since mid-December getting to know students and staff, and has been teaching classroom and small-group lessons on how to manage anxious feelings and disappointment, how to calm down in stressful situations, and how to use positive self-talk. Mr. Wolf has worked with children in various capacities over the last 20 years, including outdoor school and summer camps. He recently graduated from Liberty University with a master of education in school counseling.
- Jan. 12 Kids Matter event: Our PTA is sponsoring a special family event called Kids Matter from 6:30-8:00 p.m. Thursday. Representatives from the Snohomish County Sheriff's Office will be demonstrating the proper way to handle several different safety-related situations. There will be a police car and ice cream sandwiches. We hope to see everyone there!
- **Building access after school:** Because our office is not staffed after 4:00 p.m., we lock all doors to the main building at that time. On Mondays and Wednesdays when there is soccer, the cafeteria will be open until soccer ends at 4:30 so that students can access bathrooms.
- **Soccer and siblings:** Only students who are enrolled in our soccer program should be present on their designated day (Mondays for third grade and Wednesdays for fourth/fifth grades). Siblings cannot stay with them, since supervision is provided only for soccer players.


- Food drive: Our annual January drive to stock our food bank continues through the end of the week, and donations are always welcome! Please make sure items are not expired, or about to expire. They have to be thrown away, and this takes our volunteers extra time. Items always in demand are kid-friendly, easy-to-make foods: Mac and cheese, canned pasta, PB & J, canned tuna/chicken, soups with pull-top lids, microwave meals, cereal, etc. If you would like to access the food bank, contact the school office.
- **Health room access:** Any family member who needs to access the health room or our nursing staff needs to follow school sign-in procedures, put on a visitor sticker, notify the front desk, and then stay in the waiting area until a school staff member comes to get them. Conversations about any student's health or care are to happen in a private setting rather than in the health room if there are students present in order to protect the privacy of all.
- **Birthday treats:** This is a reminder that per our student handbook, sugary treats are not allowed. Please contact your child's teacher in advance to arrange a time to supply birthday treats. This allows us to plan ahead, as we have many students with allergy or other health issues.

As the concert approaches, students are being asked to participate in many ways to create a sense of community for the concert theme of "Togetherness." Support for students in temporary or inadequate housing

If your family is in a temporary or inadequate living situation due to a loss of housing or a family crisis, your child may be eligible for certain educational rights and services. If you lost your housing and now live in a shelter, motel, vehicle, camping ground, temporary trailer, on the street, doubled up with family or friends, or in another type of temporary or inadequate housing, your child might be able to receive help through a federal law called the McKinney-Vento Act. The McKinney-Vento Act may be able to provide support through transportation so that your child can continue enrolled in school, or through access to programs and services so that your child can participate fully in school.


